accelerate	Cause to move faster. <i>The car accelerated towards her.</i>
ascend	Travel up. <i>The lift ascended from his sight.</i>
ascending	Sloping or leading upwards. <i>The ascending plane.</i>
ascent	A climb or walk to the summit of a mountain or hill. <i>The ascent grew steeper.</i>
augmentation	The lengthening of the time values of notes in a melodic part. <i>The augmentation of the curriculum with new subjects.</i>
boost	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>The specially designed circuit boosts signal strength.</i>
climb	An ascent especially of a mountain or hill by climbing. <i>Howard started to climb out of the front seat.</i>

elevate	Give a promotion to or assign to a higher position. <i>He was elevated to Secretary of State.</i>
elevator	A shoe with a raised insole designed to make the wearer appear taller. <i>In the harbour a giant elevator stores prairie grain.</i>
ennoble	Lend greater dignity or nobility of character to. <i>The theatre is a moral instrument to ennoble the mind.</i>
escalate	Make or become more intense or serious. <i>The disturbance escalated into a full scale riot.</i>
high	High school. <i>High summer.</i>

hoist	Raise. <i>They hoisted the patient onto the operating table.</i>
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>One of Sally s stockings developed a ladder.</i>
lift	A wave that lifts the surface of the water or ground. <i>He lifted a war whoop.</i>
mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its mounting.</i>
promote	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>They are using famous personalities to promote the library nationally.</i>
raise	Multiply a number by itself a specified number of times 8 is 2 raised to the power 3. <i>Raise the price of bread.</i>
rise	Rise in rank or status. <i>I gained the crest of a rise and saw the plain stretched out before me.</i>
risen	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i>
soar	Fly or rise high in the air. <i>When she heard his voice her spirits soared.</i>
soaring	Ascending to a level markedly higher than the usual. <i>The coloured trails of soaring rockets.</i>
stepladder	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
surge	(of a crowd or a natural force) move suddenly and powerfully forward or upward. <i>Stimulated a surge of speculation.</i>
up	Denoting a flavour variety of stable quark having relatively low mass and an electric charge of $\frac{2}{3}$ In the Standard Model protons and neutrons are composed of up and down quarks. <i>The corn is up.</i>
upgrade	Rate higher; raise in value or esteem. <i>I upgraded to First Class when Coach Class was overbooked.</i>
upsurge	A sudden or abrupt strong increase. <i>An upsurge of emotion.</i>
whizz	An act of urinating. <i>Whizz the mixture to a smooth paste.</i>
zoom	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>We watched the fly zooming around.</i>
