- *Sharply exact or accurate or delimited.*
- *Used to emphasize that one is referring to an exact and particular thing.*
- *(of a person) exact, accurate, and careful about details.*
- *Marked by exactness and accuracy of expression or detail.*
- *Characterized by perfect conformity to fact or truth ; strictly correct.*



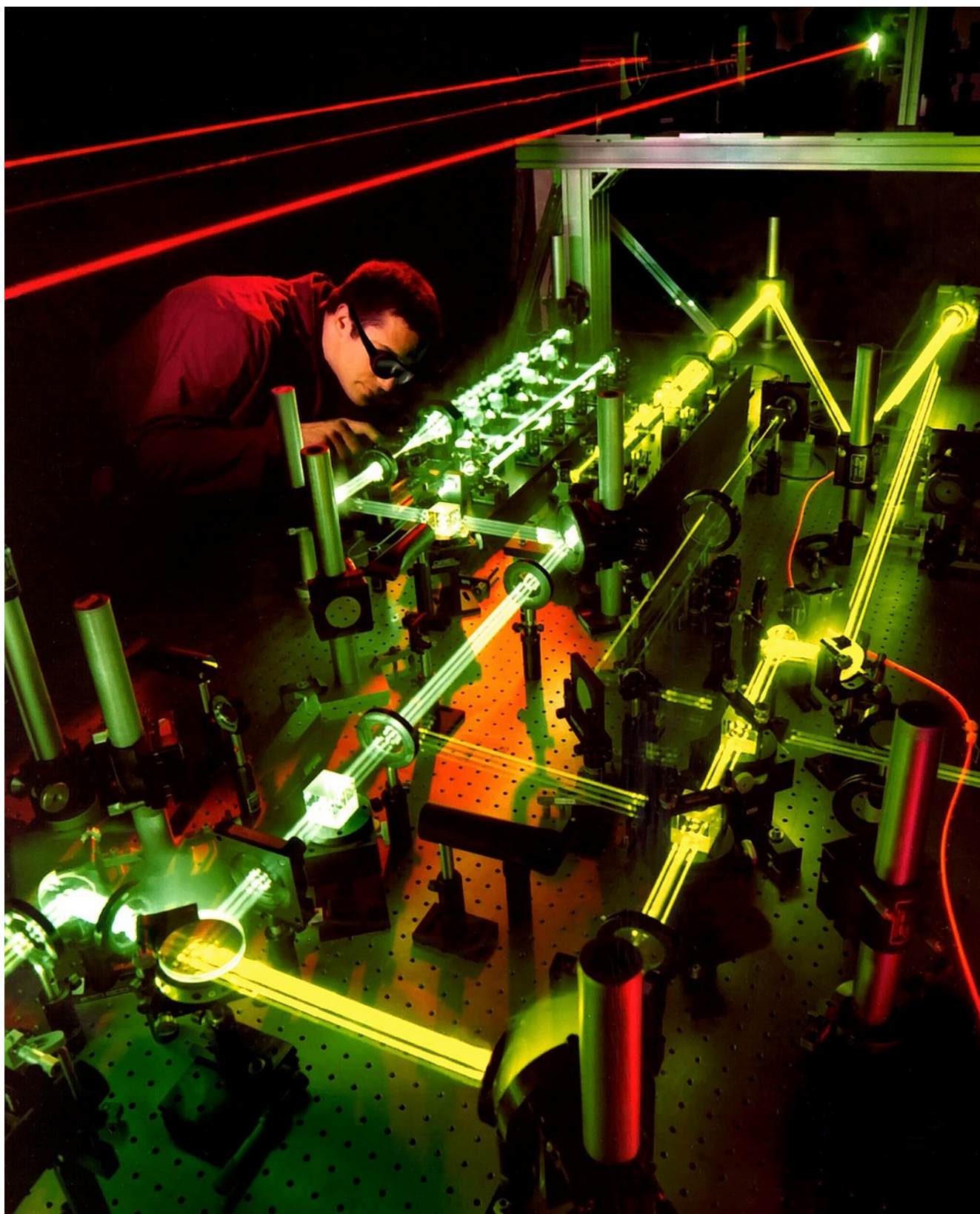
## Synonyms of "Precise" as an adjective (25 Words)

- actual** Being or reflecting the essential or genuine character of something.

- careful** Anxious to protect (something) from harm or loss; solicitous.  
***Careful** of the rights of others.*
- clear-cut** Having had all the trees removed at one time.
- close** Fitting closely but comfortably.  
*The race will be a **close** contest.*

<b>conscientious</b>	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. <i>A <b>conscientious</b> man he took his duties very seriously.</i>
<b>correct</b>	Socially right or correct. <i>He was a polite man invariably <b>correct</b> and pleasant with Mrs Collins.</i>
<b><u>definite</u></b>	(of a person) certain or sure about something. <i>I want a <b>definite</b> answer.</i>
<b>detailed</b>	Developed or executed with care and in minute detail. <i>A <b>detailed</b> plan.</i>
<b>distinct</b>	Constituting a separate entity or part. <i>The word nationalism is used in at least two <b>distinct</b> senses.</i>
<b><u>exact</u></b>	Not approximated in any way; precise. <i>Psychomedicine isn't an <b>exact</b> science yet.</i>
<b>exacting</b>	Making great demands on one's skill, attention, or other resources. <i>The <b>exacting</b> standards laid down by the organic food industry.</i>
<b><u>explicit</u></b>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i><b>Explicit</b> instructions.</i>
<b>express</b>	Not tacit or implied. <i>Her <b>express</b> wish.</i>
<b><u>methodical</u></b>	Characterized by method and orderliness. <i>A <b>methodical</b> scholar.</i>
<b><u>meticulous</u></b>	Marked by extreme care in treatment of details. <i>Almost worryingly <b>meticulous</b> in his business formalities.</i>
<b>particular</b>	Insisting that something should be correct or suitable in every detail; fastidious. <i>She gets special or <b>particular</b> satisfaction from her volunteer work.</i>
<b>pinpoint</b>	Absolutely precise; to the finest degree. <i>This weapon fired shells with <b>pinpoint</b> accuracy.</i>
<b>punctilious</b>	Showing great attention to detail or correct behaviour. <i>He was <b>punctilious</b> in providing every amenity for his guests.</i>
<b><u>rigorous</u></b>	Rigidly accurate; allowing no deviation from a standard. <i><b>Rigorous</b> controls on mergers.</i>
<b>scrupulous</b>	Very concerned to avoid doing wrong. <i><b>Scrupulous</b> attention to details.</i>
<b><u>specific</u></b>	Clearly defined or identified. <i><b>Specific</b> dielectric strength.</i>
<b>strict</b>	Characterized by strictness severity or restraint. <i>A <b>strict</b> upbringing.</i>

**unambiguous** Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning.  
*As a horror apartheid is absolutely **unambiguous**.*

**very** Real; genuine.  
*He might be phoning her at this **very** moment.*

<b>alignment</b>	The route or course of a railway or road. <i>Four railways all on different <b>alignments</b>.</i>
<b>assiduous</b>	Marked by care and persistent effort. <i>She was <b>assiduous</b> in pointing out every feature.</i>
<b>conscientious</b>	Wishing to do one's work or duty well and thoroughly. <i><b>Conscientious</b> application to the work at hand.</i>
<b>detail</b>	Provide details for. <i>The ambulances were <b>detailed</b> to the fire station.</i>
<b>detailed</b>	(of a work of art) executed with many minor decorative features. <i>A <b>detailed</b> plan.</i>
<b>elaboration</b>	The result of improving something. <i>His work led to the <b>elaboration</b> of a theory of evolution.</i>
<b>especial</b>	Better or greater than usual; special. <i>Her outburst was for my <b>especial</b> benefit.</i>
<b>exact</b>	Accurate or correct in all details. <i>She was an <b>exact</b> clever manager.</i>
<b>exactitude</b>	The quality of being precise or accurate. <i>A man of great <b>exactitude</b>.</i>
<b>exactly</b>	Just as it should be. <i>What <b>exactly</b> are you looking for.</i>
<b>exegesis</b>	Critical explanation or interpretation of a text, especially of scripture. <i>The task of biblical <b>exegesis</b>.</i>
<b>exhaustive</b>	Performed comprehensively and completely. <i>An <b>exhaustive</b> study.</i>
<b>finicky</b>	(of a person) fussy about their needs or requirements. <i>A <b>finicky</b> eater.</i>
<b>meticulous</b>	Showing great attention to detail; very careful and precise. <i>The designs are hand glazed with <b>meticulous</b> care.</i>
<b>minute</b>	The distance covered in a minute by someone driving or walking. <i>Within five <b>minutes</b> the place was virtually empty.</i>
<b>nicety</b>	A subtle difference in meaning or opinion or attitude. <i>She prided herself on her <b>nicety</b> of pronunciation.</i>
<b>painstaking</b>	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. <i><b>Painstaking</b> attention to detail.</i>
<b>painstakingly</b>	In a fastidious and painstaking manner. <i>The property has been <b>painstakingly</b> restored by its current owners.</i>

<b>particular</b>	First and most important. <i>Universals can be simultaneously exemplified by different <b>particulars</b> in different places.</i>
<b>pedantic</b>	Excessively concerned with minor details or rules; overscrupulous. <i>His analyses are careful and even painstaking but never <b>pedantic</b>.</i>
<b>pinpoint</b>	A tiny dot or point. <i>It is difficult to <b>pinpoint</b> the source of his life's inspiration.</i>
<b>precisely</b>	Indicating exactness or preciseness. <i>At 2 00 <b>precisely</b> the phone rang.</i>
<b>precision</b>	The quality of being reproducible in amount or performance. <i>The deal was planned and executed with military <b>precision</b>.</i>
<b>punctilious</b>	Marked by precise accordance with details. <i><b>Punctilious</b> in his attention to rules of etiquette.</i>
<b>scrupulous</b>	Having scruples; arising from a sense of right and wrong; principled. <i>The research has been carried out with <b>scrupulous</b> attention to detail.</i>
<b>sedulous</b>	(of a person or action) showing dedication and diligence. <i><b>Sedulous</b> pursuit of legal and moral principles.</i>
<b>specific</b>	A medicine that has a mitigating effect on a specific disease. <i>When ordering goods be <b>specific</b>.</i>
<b>technicality</b>	The state of being technical as in the use of technical terms or methods. <i>Their convictions were overturned on a <b>technicality</b>.</i>
<b>technically</b>	With reference to the technique displayed. <i><b>Technically</b> a nut is a single seeded fruit.</i>
