- *Sharply exact or accurate or delimited.*
- *Used to emphasize that one is referring to an exact and particular thing.*
- *(of a person) exact, accurate, and careful about details.*
- *Marked by exactness and accuracy of expression or detail.*
- *Characterized by perfect conformity to fact or truth ; strictly correct.*



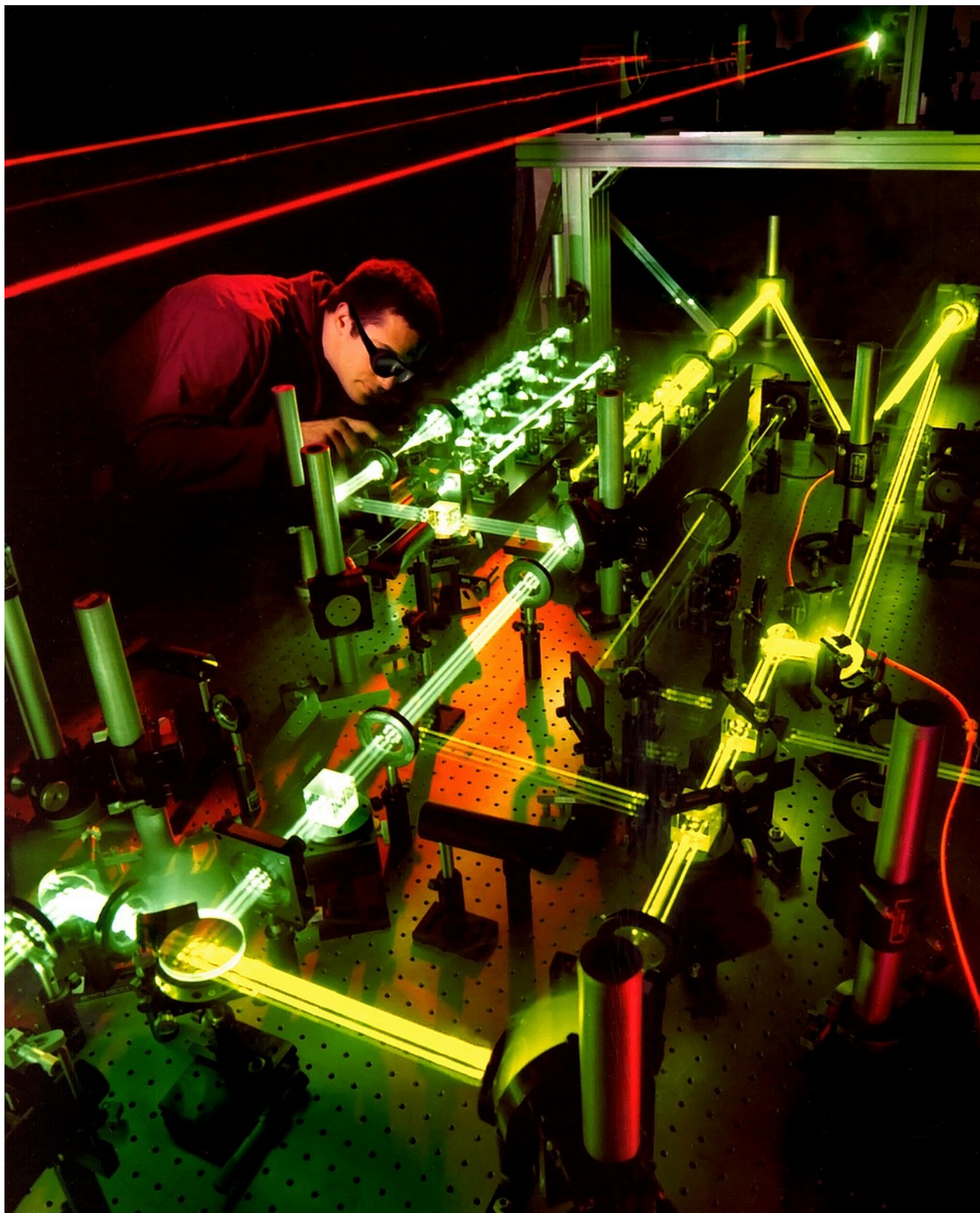
Synonyms of "Precise" as an adjective (25 Words)

accurate	Of an instrument or method capable of giving accurate information. <i>An accurate scale.</i>
actual	Being or reflecting the essential or genuine character of something- G.K.Chesterton. <i>Her actual motive.</i>
careful	Anxious to protect (something) from harm or loss; solicitous. <i>Careful of the rights of others.</i>
clear-cut	Having had all the trees removed at one time.
close	Fitting closely but comfortably. <i>The race will be a close contest.</i>

conscientious	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. A conscientious man he took his duties very seriously.
correct	Socially right or correct. He was a polite man invariably correct and pleasant with Mrs Collins.
<u>definite</u>	(of a person) certain or sure about something. I want a definite answer.
detailed	Developed or executed with care and in minute detail. A detailed plan.
distinct	Constituting a separate entity or part. The word nationalism is used in at least two distinct senses.
<u>exact</u>	Not approximated in any way; precise. Psychomedicine isn't an exact science yet.
exacting	Making great demands on one's skill, attention, or other resources. The exacting standards laid down by the organic food industry.
<u>explicit</u>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. Explicit instructions.
express	Not tacit or implied. Her express wish.
<u>methodical</u>	Characterized by method and orderliness. A methodical scholar.
<u>meticulous</u>	Marked by extreme care in treatment of details. Almost worryingly meticulous in his business formalities.
particular	Insisting that something should be correct or suitable in every detail; fastidious. She gets special or particular satisfaction from her volunteer work.
pinpoint	Absolutely precise; to the finest degree. This weapon fired shells with pinpoint accuracy.
punctilious	Showing great attention to detail or correct behaviour. He was punctilious in providing every amenity for his guests.
<u>rigorous</u>	Rigidly accurate; allowing no deviation from a standard. Rigorous controls on mergers.
scrupulous	Very concerned to avoid doing wrong. Scrupulous attention to details.
<u>specific</u>	Clearly defined or identified. Specific dielectric strength.
strict	Characterized by strictness severity or restraint. A strict upbringing.

unambiguous Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning.
*As a horror apartheid is absolutely **unambiguous**.*

very Real; genuine.
*He might be phoning her at this **very** moment.*

<u>alignment</u>	The route or course of a railway or road. <i>Four railways all on different alignments.</i>
<u>assiduous</u>	Marked by care and persistent effort. <i>She was assiduous in pointing out every feature.</i>
conscientious	Wishing to do one's work or duty well and thoroughly. <i>Conscientious application to the work at hand.</i>
detail	Provide details for. <i>The ambulances were detailed to the fire station.</i>
detailed	(of a work of art) executed with many minor decorative features. <i>A detailed plan.</i>
elaboration	The result of improving something. <i>His work led to the elaboration of a theory of evolution.</i>
especial	Better or greater than usual; special. <i>Her outburst was for my especial benefit.</i>
<u>exact</u>	Accurate or correct in all details. <i>She was an exact clever manager.</i>
exactitude	The quality of being precise or accurate. <i>A man of great exactitude.</i>
<u>exactly</u>	Just as it should be. <i>What exactly are you looking for.</i>
exegesis	Critical explanation or interpretation of a text, especially of scripture. <i>The task of biblical exegesis.</i>
<u>exhaustive</u>	Performed comprehensively and completely. <i>An exhaustive study.</i>
<u>finicky</u>	(of a person) fussy about their needs or requirements. <i>A finicky eater.</i>
<u>meticulous</u>	Showing great attention to detail; very careful and precise. <i>The designs are hand glazed with meticulous care.</i>
minute	The distance covered in a minute by someone driving or walking. <i>Within five minutes the place was virtually empty.</i>
nicety	A subtle difference in meaning or opinion or attitude. <i>She prided herself on her nicety of pronunciation.</i>
<u>painstaking</u>	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. <i>Painstaking attention to detail.</i>
painstakingly	In a fastidious and painstaking manner. <i>The property has been painstakingly restored by its current owners.</i>

particular	First and most important. <i>Universals can be simultaneously exemplified by different particulars in different places.</i>
pedantic	Excessively concerned with minor details or rules; overscrupulous. <i>His analyses are careful and even painstaking but never pedantic.</i>
pinpoint	A tiny dot or point. <i>It is difficult to pinpoint the source of his life's inspiration.</i>
precisely	Indicating exactness or preciseness. <i>At 2 00 precisely the phone rang.</i>
<u>precision</u>	The quality of being reproducible in amount or performance. <i>The deal was planned and executed with military precision.</i>
punctilious	Marked by precise accordance with details. <i>Punctilious in his attention to rules of etiquette.</i>
scrupulous	Having scruples; arising from a sense of right and wrong; principled. <i>The research has been carried out with scrupulous attention to detail.</i>
sedulous	(of a person or action) showing dedication and diligence. <i>Sedulous pursuit of legal and moral principles.</i>
<u>specific</u>	A medicine that has a mitigating effect on a specific disease. <i>When ordering goods be specific.</i>
<u>technicality</u>	The state of being technical as in the use of technical terms or methods. <i>Their convictions were overturned on a technicality.</i>
technically	With reference to the technique displayed. <i>Technically a nut is a single seeded fruit.</i>
