
Precision as a Noun

means.

exactness The quality of being accurate or correct; precision.

It is impossible to calculate with mathematical **exactness**.

exhaustive Including or considering all elements or aspects; fully comprehensive.

The guide outlines every bus route in **exhaustive** detail.

finicky (of a person) fussy about their needs or requirements.

His **finicky** copperplate hand.

infallible (in the Roman Catholic Church) credited with papal infallibility.

An **infallible** memory.

mathematical Relating to mathematics.

A mathematical whiz.

meticulous Showing great attention to detail; very careful and precise.

Almost worryingly **meticulous** in his business formalities.

micrometer A metric unit of length equal to one millionth of a meter.

Characterized by extreme care and great effort.

painstaking Painstaking attention to detail.

With great care and thoroughness.

painstakingly

The property has been painstakingly restored by its current owners.

Marked by a narrow focus on or display of learning especially its trivial

pedantic aspects.

His analyses are careful and even painstaking but never **pedantic**.

picky Exacting especially about details.

They are becoming increasingly **picky** about where they stay.

(of ideas, images, representations, expressions) characterized by perfect

precise conformity to fact or truth; strictly correct.
