Definitions of "Precision" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “precision” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The quality, condition, or fact of being exact and accurate.*
- *Marked by or adapted for accuracy and exactness.*
- *The quality of being reproducible in amount or performance.*
- *Refinement in a measurement, calculation, or specification, especially as represented by the number of digits given.*



Synonyms of "Precision" as a noun (13 Words)

- accuracy** The number of significant figures given in a number.
*The atomic clock enabled scientists to measure time with much greater **accuracy**.*
- accurateness** The state or quality of being accurate; accuracy; †carefulness (obsolete).
- clarity** Free from obscurity and easy to understand; the comprehensibility of clear expression.
*It was **clarity** of purpose that he needed.*
- clearness** The state of being free of suspicion.
- correctness** Conformity to fact or truth.
*There was evidence to support the **correctness** of the identification.*
- distinctness** The quality of being sharp and clear.
- exactitude** The quality of being exact.
*He writes with **exactitude** and precision.*

exactness	The quality of being exact. <i>He demanded exactness in all details.</i>
on target	A reference point to shoot at.
on the mark	The shortest of the four Gospels in the New Testament.
preciseness	The quality of being reproducible in amount or performance. <i>He handled it with the preciseness of an automaton.</i>
true	Proper alignment; the property possessed by something that is in correct or proper alignment. <i>Out of true.</i>
well aimed	A deep hole or shaft dug or drilled to obtain water or oil or gas or brine.



Usage Examples of "Precision" as a noun

- *A technique which examines and identifies each character with the highest level of precision.*
- *A precision of six decimal figures.*
- *Note the meticulous precision of his measurements.*
- *The deal was planned and executed with military precision.*
- *A precision instrument.*

accuracy	The quality of being near to the true value. <i>He was beginning to doubt the accuracy of his compass.</i>
accurate	Of an instrument or method capable of giving accurate information. <i>An accurate thermometer.</i>
arithmetic	Relating to arithmetic. <i>The laws of arithmetic.</i>
<u>assiduous</u>	Marked by care and persistent effort. <i>Her assiduous attempts to learn French.</i>
<u>careful</u>	Prudent in the use of something, especially money. <i>I begged him to be more careful.</i>
conscientious	Guided by or in accordance with conscience or sense of right and wrong. <i>Conscientious application to the work at hand.</i>
<u>dependability</u>	The quality of being trustworthy and reliable. <i>The brand has built its reputation on rock solid dependability.</i>
detail	Provide details for. <i>Several of the details are similar.</i>
detailed	Having many details or facts; showing attention to detail. <i>More detailed information was needed.</i>

exact	Demand and obtain (something) from someone. <i>Psychomedicine isn't an exact science yet.</i>
exactitude	The quality of being precise or accurate. <i>It is not possible to say with any scientific exactitude what a dream means.</i>
exactness	The quality of being accurate or correct; precision. <i>It is impossible to calculate with mathematical exactness.</i>
exhaustive	Including or considering all elements or aspects; fully comprehensive. <i>The guide outlines every bus route in exhaustive detail.</i>
finicky	(of a person) fussy about their needs or requirements. <i>His finicky copperplate hand.</i>
infallible	(in the Roman Catholic Church) credited with papal infallibility. <i>An infallible memory.</i>
mathematical	Relating to mathematics. <i>A mathematical whiz.</i>
meticulous	Showing great attention to detail; very careful and precise. <i>Almost worryingly meticulous in his business formalities.</i>
micrometer	A metric unit of length equal to one millionth of a meter.
painstaking	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. <i>Painstaking attention to detail.</i>
painstakingly	With great care and thoroughness. <i>The property has been painstakingly restored by its current owners.</i>
pedantic	Marked by a narrow focus on or display of learning especially its trivial aspects. <i>His analyses are careful and even painstaking but never pedantic.</i>
picky	Exacting especially about details. <i>They are becoming increasingly picky about where they stay.</i>
precise	(of ideas, images, representations, expressions) characterized by perfect conformity to fact or truth; strictly correct. <i>Arrived at the precise moment.</i>
punctilious	Marked by precise accordance with details. <i>He was punctilious in providing every amenity for his guests.</i>
scrupulous	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. <i>Less scrupulous producers sent bundles that were deceptive in appearance.</i>
sedulous	Marked by care and persistent effort. <i>Sedulous pursuit of legal and moral principles.</i>

- studious** Done deliberately or with a purpose in mind.
*Made a **studious** attempt to fix the television set.*
- tradeoff** An exchange that occurs as a compromise.
*I faced a **tradeoff** between eating and buying my medicine.*
- unerring** Always right or accurate.
*An **unerring** marksman.*
- verisimilitude** The appearance of being true or real.
*The detail gives the novel some **verisimilitude**.*
