- Wolves are major predators of rodents.
- A defensive move to prevent the business falling into the hands of an overseas predator.
- A sexual predator.

blackbird Common black European thrush.

camel A yellowish fawn colour like that of camel hair.

Easy belted styles in **camel** or charcoal are the perfect winter coat.

carnivore Any animal that feeds on flesh.

Terrestrial carnivores have four or five clawed digits on each limb.

cheetah A large slender spotted cat found in Africa and parts of Asia. It is the fastest

animal on land.

eagle A figure of an eagle especially as a symbol of the US.

He also had an **eagle** three at the ninth.

<u>elephant</u> Five-toed pachyderm.



A female falcon especially a peregrine.

hawk Of a person hunt game with a trained hawk.

insectivore A mammal of the obsolete order Insectivora.

leopard Spotted like a leopard. A **leopard** print outfit.

lion A celebrity who is lionized much sought after.

Any warm-blooded vertebrate having the skin more or less covered with hair;

Cats and other **mammalian** predators.

marauder A person who marauds; a raider.

A band of English **marauder**s were surprised and overcome.

marsupial Relating to the marsupials.

omnivore A person who eats all kinds of foods.

Nocturnal bird of prey with hawk-like beak and claws and large head with

front-facing eyes.

pachyderm Any of various nonruminant hoofed mammals having very thick skin:

elephant; rhinoceros; hippopotamus.

panther A leopard, especially a black one.

pouched Having a pouch.

quadruped An animal which has four feet, especially an ungulate mammal.

Primitive **quadruped** simian species.

raptor A dromaeosaurid dinosaur especially a velociraptor or utahraptor.

rhinoceros Massive powerful herbivorous odd-toed ungulate of southeast Asia and Africa

having very thick skin and one or two horns on the snout.

shrew A scolding nagging bad-tempered woman.

Hold your nagging tongue you miserable old **shrew**.

vulture

vertebrate Denoting a vertebrate or relating to the vertebrates as a group.

vicious Marked by deep ill will; deliberately harmful.

The dog was **vicious** and likely to bite.

A large bird of prey with the head and neck more or less bare of feathers,

feeding chiefly on carrion and reputed to gather with others in anticipation of

the death of a sick or injured animal or person.

Rock musicians are set upon by vulture managers.
