<b>established in advance</b>	Introduced from another region and persisting without cultivation.
<b>fated</b>	(usually followed by `to') determined by tragic fate. <i><b>Fated</b> to be the scene of Kennedy's assassination.</i>
<b>fixed</b>	Of a number having a fixed and unchanging value. <i>A <b>fixed</b> piece of wood.</i>
<b>foreordained</b>	Established or prearranged unalterably. <i>His place in history was <b>foreordained</b>.</i>
<b>prearranged</b>	Arranged or agreed upon in advance. <i>Did she have a <b>prearranged</b> meeting.</i>
<b>predestined</b>	Established or prearranged unalterably. <i>Our <b>predestined</b> end.</i>
<b>preordained</b>	(of an outcome or course of action) decided or determined beforehand; predestined. <i>A divinely <b>preordained</b> plan of creation.</i>
<b>preset</b>	(of a setting on a device) adjusted or applied in advance. <i>The water is heated quickly to a <b>preset</b> temperature.</i>
<b>set</b>	Set down according to a plan. <i>With eyes <b>set</b> in a fixed glassy stare.</i>
<b>settled</b>	Inhabited by colonists. <i><b>Settled</b> areas.</i>

<b>injustice</b>	The practice of being unjust or unfair. <i>Brooding over life s <b>injustices</b>.</i>
<b>misinform</b>	Give (someone) false or inaccurate information. <i>I m afraid you have been <b>misinformed</b>.</i>
<b>narrowed</b>	Made narrow; limited in breadth. <i>A <b>narrowed</b> view of the world.</i>
<b>optional</b>	Available to be chosen but not obligatory. <i>A wide range of <b>optional</b> excursions is offered.</i>
