aptness	A disposition to behave in a certain way. <i>The aptness of iron to rust.</i>
biologically	In a way that concerns biology or living organisms. <i>Biologically rooted instincts.</i>
character	A characteristic property that defines the apparent individual nature of something. <i>The actor's TV character is often on the wrong side of the law.</i>
emphasize	Give extra weight to (a communication). <i>Her gesture emphasized her words.</i>
genetically	By genetic mechanisms. <i>A genetically inherited condition.</i>
impression	An impressionistic portrayal of a person. <i>The floor was too dirty for the mop to make much impression.</i>
inclination	The act of inclining; bending forward. <i>The questioner's inclination of his head.</i>
incline	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>The bunker doors incline outwards.</i>
influence	A person or thing with the capacity to have an influence on someone or something. <i>He was a bad influence on the children.</i>
inspired	Being of such surpassing excellence as to suggest inspiration by the gods. <i>Inspired air must be humidified.</i>
lean	Cause to lean or incline. <i>A man was leaning against the wall.</i>
leaning	The act of deviating from a vertical position. <i>He felt leanings toward frivolity.</i>

liking	A taste for. <i>She'd taken an instant liking to Arnie's new girlfriend.</i>
penchant	A strong or habitual liking for something or tendency to do something. <i>The Irish have a penchant for blarney.</i>
predilection	A preference or special liking for something; a bias in favour of something. <i>A predilection for expensive cars.</i>
predisposition	Susceptibility to a pathogen. <i>Factors including genetic predisposition.</i>
preference	A predisposition in favor of something. <i>Nearly 40 per cent named acid house as their musical preference.</i>
proclivity	A natural inclination. <i>A proclivity for hard work.</i>
prone	Lying face downward. <i>Failure prone.</i>
proneness	Being disposed to do something. <i>His proneness to injury will seriously mar a promising career.</i>
propensity	A disposition to behave in a certain way. <i>The propensity of disease to spread.</i>
savor	Give taste to. <i>Savor the soup.</i>
savour	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>Their genuflections savoured of superstition and popery.</i>
streak	Cover a surface with streaks. <i>A streak for charity.</i>
temperament	The adjustment of intervals in tuning a piano or other musical instrument so as to fit the scale for use in different keys in equal temperament the octave consists of twelve equal semitones. <i>This temperament became standard tuning for all the new organs.</i>
tend	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>Walter tended towards corpulence.</i>
tendency	A general direction in which something tends to move. <i>A tendency to be too strict.</i>
trend	(of a topic) be the subject of many posts on a social media website or application within a short period of time. <i>The Richelieu River rending southward to Lake Champlain.</i>
whim	An odd or fanciful or capricious idea. <i>Whimsy can be humorous to someone with time to enjoy it.</i>
