appreciable Large or important enough to be noticed.
*Pupils may have to travel **appreciable** distances.*

awesome	Inspiring awe or admiration or wonder. <i>The awesome complexity of the universe.</i>
conspicuous	Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious. <i>He was very thin with a conspicuous Adam s apple.</i>
detectable	Easily seen or detected. <i>An easily detectable and treatable disorder.</i>
discernible	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>An essay with a meaning that was not always discernible.</i>
distinctly	In a way that is readily distinguishable by the senses; clearly. <i>Two distinctly different cultures.</i>
eminent	(of a person) famous and respected within a particular sphere. <i>The book s scholarship and eminent readability.</i>
evident	Clearly seen or understood; obvious. <i>A clearly evident erasure in the manuscript.</i>
manifest	Record in a ship s manifest. <i>Manifest disapproval.</i>
marked	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>A scar marked face.</i>
marvelous	Too improbable to admit of belief. <i>A marvelous collection of rare books.</i>
memorable	Worth remembering. <i>He recalled memorable moments in his life.</i>
notable	Worthy of attention or notice; remarkable. <i>The gardens are notable for their collection of magnolias and camellias.</i>
noted	Widely known and esteemed. <i>The restaurant is noted for its high standards of cuisine.</i>
noteworthy	Worth paying attention to; interesting or significant. <i>A noteworthy fact is that her students rarely complain.</i>
noticeable	Undesirably noticeable. <i>After a noticeable pause the lecturer continued.</i>
observable	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>Observable differences.</i>
obtrusive	Noticeable or prominent in an unwelcome or intrusive way. <i>Equally obtrusive was the graffiti.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>It was an obvious remark to make.</i>

- outstanding** Distinguished from others in excellence.
*Much of the work is still **outstanding**.*
- perceptible** Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind.
*A **perceptible** limp.*
- phenomenal** Remarkable or exceptional, especially exceptionally good.
*The **phenomenal** world.*
- prominent** Important; famous.
*A new theory is the most **prominent** feature of the book.*
- pronounced** Very noticeable or marked; conspicuous.
*A **pronounced** flavor of cinnamon.*
- remarkable** Worthy of notice.
*A **remarkable** achievement.*
- renowned** Widely known and esteemed.
*A **renowned** author.*
- striking** The action of striking.
*His **striking** good looks always created a sensation.*
- substantial** Concerning the essentials of something.
*Breakfast is a **substantial** buffet.*
- visibly** In a way that is visible to the eye.
*The defendant paled **visibly** as the guilty verdict was announced.*
