qualification	The qualification stage of a sporting event. <i>Her qualification as a barrister.</i>
requirement	Anything indispensable. <i>Applicants must satisfy the normal entry requirements.</i>
requisite	Anything indispensable. <i>She believed privacy to be a requisite for a peaceful life.</i>
rudiment	An undeveloped or immature part or organ, especially a structure in an embryo or larva which will develop into an organ, limb, etc. <i>The rudiments of a hot water system.</i>

meaningful	Having a meaning or purpose. <i>A meaningful explanation.</i>
<u>must</u>	Be obliged to; should (expressing necessity). <i>This video is a must for everyone.</i>
necessary	Unavoidably determined by prior circumstances. <i>They granted the necessary planning permission.</i>
necessity	A condition that cannot be otherwise, or a statement asserting this. <i>Political necessity induced him to consider it.</i>
need	Have need of. <i>I won't detain you for longer than I need.</i>
needs	Of necessity. <i>We must needs by objective.</i>

obligate	Bind by an obligation; cause to be indebted. <i>The medical establishment is obligated to take action in the best interest of the public.</i>
perforce	By necessity; by force of circumstance. <i>Amateurs perforce have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
<u>primary</u>	A primary colour. <i>A primary teacher.</i>
<u>prior</u>	The head of a religious order in an abbey the prior is next below the abbot. <i>He had no juvenile record no priors.</i>
proviso	A stipulated condition. <i>He let his house with the proviso that his own staff should remain to run it.</i>
required	Required by rule. <i>The corset the garment that ensured the required female shape.</i>
requisite	Made necessary by particular circumstances or regulations. <i>A place where the requisites of water fuel and fodder can be obtained.</i>
<u>staple</u>	Secure or fasten with a staple or staples. <i>Merrill stapled a batch of papers together.</i>
<u>unavoidable</u>	Impossible to avoid or evade. <i>The natural and unavoidable consequences of growing old.</i>
<u>underlying</u>	Located beneath or below. <i>Guaranteeing more dollars may temporarily ease their troubles but will not alleviate the underlying causes of their poverty.</i>
<u>vital</u>	Absolutely necessary; essential. <i>Blood and other vital fluids.</i>
