crucial	Having crucial relevance. <i>A crucial election.</i>
<u>elemental</u>	Relating to or being an element. <i>Failure is always apparent at this elemental level.</i>
elements	Violent or severe weather viewed as caused by the action of the four elements. <i>They felt the full fury of the elements.</i>
essential	Absolutely necessary; extremely important. <i>Funds essential to the completion of the project.</i>
<u>front</u>	Act as a front or cover for illegal or secret activity. <i>She rolled over on to her front.</i>
indispensability	The quality possessed by something that you cannot possibly do without.
<u>indispensable</u>	Absolutely necessary; vitally necessary. <i>The routine but indispensable ceremonies of state.</i>
<u>integral</u>	The result of a mathematical integration $F(x)$ is the integral of $f(x)$ if $dF = f(x) dx$. <i>The first integral recording of the ten Mahler symphonies.</i>
<u>main</u>	The source of public water, gas, or electricity supply through pipes or cables. <i>Switch off the mains supply.</i>
meaningful	Having a recognizable function in a logical language or other sign system. <i>A meaningful discussion.</i>
<u>must</u>	The quality of smelling or tasting old or stale or mouldy. <i>She said she must be going.</i>
necessary	Needed to be done, achieved, or present; essential. <i>They granted the necessary planning permission.</i>
necessity	The principle according to which something must be so, by virtue either of logic or of natural law. <i>The necessity of growing old.</i>
need	Have or feel a need for. <i>He had sufficient means to meet his simple needs.</i>

needs	Of necessity. <i>We must needs by objective.</i>
obligate	Commit in order to fulfill an obligation. <i>The money must be obligated within 30 days.</i>
perforce	Used to express necessity or inevitability. <i>Amateurs perforce have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
<u>primary</u>	A primary coil or winding in an electrical transformer. <i>His expert handling of the primary and secondary literature is clear on every page.</i>
<u>prior</u>	The head of a religious order in an abbey the prior is next below the abbot. <i>He had no juvenile record no priors.</i>
proviso	A condition or qualification attached to an agreement or statement. <i>He let his house with the proviso that his own staff should remain to run it.</i>
required	Required by rule. <i>Required reading.</i>
requisite	Made necessary by particular circumstances or regulations. <i>A place where the requisites of water fuel and fodder can be obtained.</i>
<u>staple</u>	Attach or secure with a staple or staples. <i>Staple fibers vary widely in length.</i>
<u>unavoidable</u>	Not able to be avoided, prevented, or ignored; inevitable. <i>An unavoidable accident.</i>
<u>underlying</u>	Located beneath or below. <i>Underlying problems need to be addressed.</i>
<u>vital</u>	Urgently needed; absolutely necessary. <i>Of vital interest.</i>
