| <b>foresight</b>             | The front sight of a gun.<br><i>He had the <b>foresight</b> to check that his escape route was clear.</i>   |
| <b>insight</b>               | The clear (and often sudden) understanding of a complex situation.<br><i>His mind soared to previously unattainable heights of <b>insight</b>.</i>  |
| <b>insightful</b>            | Exhibiting insight or clear and deep perception.<br><i>The chapter is <b>insightful</b> and suggestive of new perspectives.</i>   |
| <b>intelligent</b>           | Having or showing intelligence, especially of a high level.<br><i>Is there <b>intelligent</b> life in the universe.</i>   |
| <b>judgment</b>              | The act of judging or assessing a person or situation or event.<br><i>He was reluctant to make his <b>judgment</b> known.</i>   |
| <b>knowing</b>               | Highly educated; having extensive information or understanding.<br><i>Today's society is too <b>knowing</b> too corrupt.</i>  |
| <b>perceptive</b>            | Having or showing sensitive insight.<br><i>A <b>perceptive</b> observation.</i>   |
| <b>percipient</b>            | A person who becomes aware (of things or events) through the senses.<br><i>A <b>percipient</b> author.</i>  |
| <b>perspicacious</b>         | Mentally acute or penetratingly discerning.<br><i>Much too <b>perspicacious</b> to be taken in by so spurious an argument.</i>  |

| <b>perspicacity</b>  | The capacity to assess situations or circumstances shrewdly and to draw sound conclusions.<br><i>The <b>perspicacity</b> of her remarks.</i>  |
| <b>politic</b>       | Engage in political activity.<br><i>A <b>politic</b> old scoundrel.</i>   |
| <b>prediction</b>    | A statement made about the future.<br><i>A <b>prediction</b> that economic growth would resume.</i>   |
| <b>sagacious</b>     | Skillful in statecraft or management.<br><i>Observant and thoughtful he was given to asking <b>sagacious</b> questions.</i>   |
