### **chairperson**

The officer who presides at the meetings of an organization.  
*Address your remarks to the **chairperson**.*

### **chairwoman**

A woman who is the administrative head of a department of instruction at a college or university.

### **chancellor**

The president or chief administrative officer of a university.  
*The Lord **chancellor** and the judges will consider the application.*

<b>chief</b>	A person who is in charge. <i>The <b>chief</b> of police.</i>
<b>chief executive</b>	A person who exercises control over workers.
<b>chief of state</b>	A person who is in charge.
<b>dean</b>	(in a college or university, especially Oxford or Cambridge) a senior member of a college, with disciplinary and advisory functions. <i>He is the <b>dean</b> of foreign correspondents.</i>
<b>director</b>	Member of a board of directors. <i>The sales <b>director</b>.</i>
<b>figurehead</b>	A carving, typically a bust or a full-length figure, set at the prow of an old-fashioned sailing ship.
<b>governor</b>	The elected executive head of a state of the US. <i>The <b>governor</b> of the Bank of England.</i>
<b>head</b>	The obverse side of a coin that usually bears the representation of a person's head. <i>Huge <b>heads</b> of fluffy cream flowers.</i>
<b>head of state</b>	That part of a skeletal muscle that is away from the bone that it moves.
<b>leader</b>	A series of dots or dashes across the page to guide the eye, especially in tabulated material. <i>Nora was up among the <b>leaders</b>.</i>
<b>master</b>	Someone who holds a master's degree from academic institution. <i>I'm a <b>master</b> of disguise.</i>
<b>president of the united states</b>	The head administrative officer of a college or university.
<b>prexy</b>	The head administrative officer of a college or university.
<b>principal</b>	An actor who plays a principal role. <i>The winners are paid from the interest without even touching the <b>principal</b>.</i>
<b>provost</b>	The Protestant minister of the principal church of a town or district in Germany and certain other European countries.
<b>rector</b>	The head of certain universities, colleges, and schools.
<b>vice chancellor</b>	A specific form of evil-doing.
<b><u>warden</u></b>	A prison governor. <i>Securely handcuffed to a <b>warden</b> he was taken to Wandsworth Prison.</i>

## Associations of "President" (30 Words)

<b><u>abstention</u></b>	The trait of abstaining (especially from alcohol). <i>A resolution passed by 126 votes to none with six <b>abstentions</b>.</i>
<b>alderman</b>	A member of a municipal legislative body (as a city council.
<b>appoint</b>	Furnish. <i>They <b>appointed</b> a day in May for the meeting.</i>
<b>ballot</b>	The total number of votes cast in a ballot. <i>He won 54 per cent of the <b>ballot</b>.</i>
<b>candidate</b>	A person taking an examination. <i>She was the perfect <b>candidate</b> for a biography.</i>
<b>caucus</b>	Of a voter attend an electoral caucus especially on behalf of a particular candidate. <i>More than half of those young people that <b>caucused</b> yesterday <b>caucused</b> for Barack Obama.</i>
<b>commissioner</b>	A representative of the supreme authority in an area. <i>A baseball <b>commissioner</b>.</i>

<b>countersign</b>	A secret word or phrase known only to a restricted group. <i>You must <b>countersign</b> on this line of the contract.</i>
<b>democratic</b>	Characterized by or advocating or based upon the principles of democracy or social equality- George du Maurier. <i><b>Democratic</b> art forms.</i>
<b>elect</b>	Selected as the best. <i>They <b>elected</b> him leader.</i>
<b>elected</b>	Subject to popular election.
<b>election</b>	The action of electing or the fact of being elected. <i>The 2008 local council <b>elections</b>.</i>
<b>elective</b>	(of a person or office) appointed or filled by election. <i>The National Assembly with 125 <b>elective</b> members.</i>
<b>electorate</b>	The area represented by one Member of Parliament. <i>75 per cent of the <b>electorate</b> voted for a Scottish parliament in some form.</i>
<b>governor</b>	The representative of the British Crown in a colony or in a Commonwealth state that regards the monarch as head of state. <i>The <b>governor</b> of the Bank of England.</i>
<b>hustings</b>	The campaigning associated with an election. <i>I was out on the <b>hustings</b> talking to people.</i>
<b>incoming</b>	Arriving at a place or position. <i><b>Incoming</b> Indonesian settlers.</i>
<b>mayor</b>	(in England, Wales, and Northern Ireland) the head of a town, borough, or county council, elected by council members and generally having purely ceremonial duties.
<b>minister</b>	Act as a minister of religion. <i>Will these women be permitted to <b>minister</b> as priests.</i>
<b>nominate</b>	Put forward nominate for appointment to an office or for an honor or position. <i><b>Nominate</b> a committee.</i>
<b>nomination</b>	An address (usually at a political convention) proposing the name of a candidate to run for election. <i>Send your <b>nominations</b> in by 30th November.</i>
<b>presidential</b>	Relating to a president or presidency. <i><b>Presidential</b> advisers.</i>
<b>reelect</b>	Elect again.
<b>referendum</b>	A general vote by the electorate on a single political question which has been referred to them for a direct decision.

**satrap**

Any subordinate or local ruler.

**suffrage**

The right to vote in political elections.

*The women s **suffrage** movement.*

**tenure**

Guaranteed permanent employment especially as a teacher or lecturer after a probationary period security of tenure.

***Tenure** for university staff has been abolished.*

**viceroy**

Governor of a country or province who rules as the representative of his or her king or sovereign.

**voter**

A person who votes or has the right to vote at an election.

**voting**

A choice that is made by counting the number of people in favor of each alternative.
