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## Associations of "Pressed" (30 Words)

<b>bazaar</b>	A shop where a variety of goods are sold. <i>The church <b>bazaar</b>.</i>
<b>clump</b>	Form a clump or clumps. <i>The particles tend to <b>clump</b> together.</i>
<a href="#">compact</a>	A mass of powdered metal compacted together in preparation for sintering. <i>The foundation of the walls <b>compacted</b> of Granite and Lime.</i>
<b>compactly</b>	In a compact manner or state. <i>He wrote <b>compactly</b> but clearly.</i>
<b>compendious</b>	Briefly giving the gist of something. <i>A short and <b>compendious</b> book.</i>
<a href="#">compress</a>	Flatten by pressure; squeeze or press. <i><b>Compress</b> the data.</i>
<b>compressed</b>	Reduced in volume by pressure. <i><b>Compressed</b> earth blocks.</i>
<b>compression</b>	An increase in the density of something.
<a href="#">concise</a>	Giving a lot of information clearly and in a few words; brief but comprehensive. <i>A <b>concise</b> explanation.</i>
<a href="#">condense</a>	Compress or concentrate. <i>Her feelings <b>condensed</b>.</i>
<b>connote</b>	Involve as a necessary condition of consequence; as in logic. <i>Spinsterhood <b>connoted</b> failure.</i>
<a href="#">constrict</a>	Become tight or as if tight. <i>Her throat <b>constricted</b>.</i>
<b>constricted</b>	Inhibited; restricted. <i>A <b>constricted</b> blood vessel.</i>

<b><u>crowded</u></b>	(of a space) full of people, leaving little or no room for movement; packed. <i>A very <b>crowded</b> room.</i>
<b>dense</b>	Hard to pass through because of dense growth. <i>She made her way through the <b>dense</b> undergrowth.</i>
<b>filled</b>	Of purchase orders that have been filled. <i>Fog <b>filled</b> air.</i>
<b>impenetrable</b>	Impossible to understand. <i><b>Impenetrable</b> rain forests.</i>
<b>jammed</b>	Extremely crowded or filled to capacity. <i>A suitcase <b>jammed</b> with dirty clothes.</i>
<b><u>lush</u></b>	Characterized by extravagance and profusion. <i>These architecture magazines are full of the <b>lush</b> interiors of the rich and famous.</i>
<b>narrowed</b>	Reduced in size as by squeezing together. <i>His <b>narrowed</b> eyes.</i>
<b>nonporous</b>	Not porous; especially not having vessels that appear as pores.
<b><u>packed</u></b>	Pressed together or compressed. <i><b>Packed</b> snow.</i>
<b>refrigerant</b>	Causing cooling or freezing. <i>A <b>refrigerant</b> substance such as ice or solid carbon dioxide.</i>
<b><u>teeming</u></b>	Abundantly filled with especially living things. <i>The Third World s <b>teeming</b> millions.</i>
<b><u>thick</u></b>	Spoken as if with a thick tongue. <i>Stephen woke late his head <b>thick</b> and his mouth sour.</i>
<b>thickly</b>	With thickness; in a thick manner. <i>A field <b>thickly</b> coated with snow.</i>
<b><u>thorough</u></b>	Painstakingly careful and accurate. <i>The child is being a <b>thorough</b> nuisance.</i>
<b>tight</b>	Pulled or drawn tight. <i>The bolts are <b>tight</b>.</i>
<b>tightly</b>	With very firm or strict control. <i>A <b>tightly</b> sealed container.</i>
<b>underbrush</b>	The brush (small trees and bushes and ferns etc.) growing beneath taller trees in a wood or forest.
