Associations of "Pressured" (30 Words)

accentuate	Make more noticeable or prominent. <i>His jacket unfortunately accentuated his paunch.</i>
compact	Have the property of being packable or of compacting easily. Compact soil.
compactly	With concise and precise brevity; to the point. <i>He wrote compactly but clearly.</i>
compress	A cloth pad or dressing (with or without medication) applied firmly to some part of the body (to relieve discomfort or reduce fever). <i>She compressed her lips.</i>
compressed	Reduced in volume by pressure. <i>With lips compressed.</i>
condense	Cause a gas or vapor to change into a liquid. <i>The moisture vapour in the air condenses into droplets of water.</i>
constrict	Become tight or as if tight. <i>Boas constrict and suffocate their prey.</i>
disharmony	Lack of harmony or agreement. <i>We will become evermore a nation of social disharmony.</i>
emphasize	Give extra weight to (a communication). <i>A hip length jacket which emphasized her shape.</i>
emphatically	In a forceful way. <i>No way he said emphatically.</i>
exert	Have and exercise. <i>The moon exerts a force on the Earth.</i>
highlight	Mark with a highlighter. <i>The issues highlighted by the report.</i>
importance	The quality of being important and worthy of note. <i>An issue of great importance.</i>

<u>imprint</u>	A distinctive influence. <i>Years in the colonies had left their imprint.</i>
intension	What you must know in order to determine the reference of an expression.
<u>minimize</u>	Represent or estimate at less than the true value or importance. <i>The aim is to minimize costs.</i>
overburden	Burden with too much work or responsibility. <i>They were overburdened with luggage.</i>
pains	An effortful attempt to attain a goal.
<u>pressed</u>	Compacted by ironing. <i>Immaculately pressed trousers.</i>
refrigerant	Any substance used to provide cooling (as in a refrigerator). <i>A refrigerant substance such as ice or solid carbon dioxide.</i>
sift	An act of sifting something especially so as to isolate that which is most important. <i>Sift the flour into a large bowl.</i>
<u>squash</u>	Edible fruit of a squash plant eaten as a vegetable. <i>She squashed some of her clothes inside the bag.</i>
<u>squeeze</u>	Squeeze someone tightly in your arms usually with fondness. <i>She squeezed herself into her tightest pair of jeans.</i>
strain	Rub through a strainer or process in an electric blender. <i>His voice was so quiet that I had to strain to hear it.</i>
stress	The degree of stress measured in units of force per unit area. <i>This type of workout does stress the shoulder and knee joints.</i>
tension	Electromotive force. <i>A mind which is affected by stress or tension cannot think as clearly.</i>
tighten	Narrow or limit. <i>Central government has tightened control over local authority spending.</i>
<u>underline</u>	Draw a line or lines underneath to call attention to. <i>The improvement in retail sales was underlined by these figures.</i>
<u>underscore</u>	(on a computer or typewriter keyboard) a short horizontal line _ on the baseline. <i>The company underscored the progress made with fuel cells.</i>
wrench	Turn something especially a nut or bolt with a wrench. <i>Wrench oneself free from somebody's grip.</i>
