This lull **forebode**d some new assault upon him.

forecast Judge to be probable.

Rain is **forecast** for Scotland.

forecasting A statement made about the future.

foresee Act in advance of; deal with ahead of time.

It is impossible to **foresee** how life will work out.

foretell Foreshadow or presage.

A seer had foretold that the earl would assume the throne.

An estimate or conclusion formed by guessing.

He took her aside and I **guess**ed that he was offering her a job.

The process or results of guessing.

guesswork Answering this question will involve you in a certain amount of

guesswork.

maybe A mere possibility or probability.

Maybe I won t go back.

preconception An opinion formed beforehand without adequate evidence.

He did not even try to confirm his **preconception**s.

prognosticate Make a prediction about; tell in advance.

prophesy Predict or reveal through, or as if through, divine inspiration.

speculation An investment that is very risky but could yield great profits.

The company s move into property **speculation**.

Expect believe or suppose.

Suppose he had been murdered what then.

A belief held without proof or certain knowledge; an assumption or

supposition hypothesis.

They were working on the **supposition** that his death was murder.

Infer from incomplete evidence.
