## Associations of "Presuppose definition" (30 Words)

<b>anticipate</b>	Look forward to. <i>It was <b>anticipated</b> that the rains would slow the military campaign.</i>
<b>anticipation</b>	The action of anticipating something; expectation or prediction. <i>Each of them had their own <b>anticipations</b>.</i>
<a href="#">anticipatory</a>	(of a breach of contract) taking the form of an announcement or indication that a contract will not be honoured. <i>An <b>anticipatory</b> flash of excitement.</i>
<b>aspirant</b>	An ambitious and aspiring young person. <i>An <b>aspirant</b> to the throne.</i>
<a href="#">aspiring</a>	Directing one’s hopes or ambitions towards becoming a specified type of person. <i>An <b>aspiring</b> artist.</i>
<a href="#">assume</a>	Take on a certain form, attribute, or aspect. <i>She <b>assumed</b> strange manners.</i>
<b>assumption</b>	The act of assuming or taking for granted. <i>Any society is built upon certain <b>assumptions</b>.</i>
<b>astrologer</b>	A person who uses astrology to tell others about their character or to predict their future. <i>He was advised by <b>astrologers</b> to delay his departure.</i>
<a href="#">conjecture</a>	Form an opinion or supposition about (something) on the basis of incomplete information. <i>A matter for <b>conjecture</b>.</i>
<b>envisage</b>	Contemplate or conceive of as a possibility or a desirable future event. <i>The Rome Treaty <b>envisaged</b> free movement across frontiers.</i>
<a href="#">expect</a>	Consider obligatory request and expect. <i>I m <b>expecting</b> a full explanation as to why these files were destroyed.</i>
<b>expectancy</b>	Something expected (as on the basis of a norm). <i>An indicator of <b>expectancy</b> in development.</i>

<b>expectation</b>	Belief about (or mental picture of) the future. <i>I sat down in <b>expectation</b> of a feast of nostalgia.</i>
<b>forebode</b>	Make a prediction about; tell in advance. <i>This lull <b>foreboded</b> some new assault upon him.</i>
<b>forecast</b>	Judge to be probable. <i>Rain is <b>forecast</b> for Scotland.</i>
<b>forecasting</b>	A statement made about the future.
<b>foresee</b>	Act in advance of; deal with ahead of time. <i>It is impossible to <b>foresee</b> how life will work out.</i>
<b>foretell</b>	Foreshadow or presage. <i>A seer had foretold that the earl would assume the throne.</i>
<b>guess</b>	An estimate or conclusion formed by guessing. <i>He took her aside and I <b>guessed</b> that he was offering her a job.</i>
<b>guesswork</b>	The process or results of guessing. <i>Answering this question will involve you in a certain amount of <b>guesswork</b>.</i>
<b>maybe</b>	A mere possibility or probability. <i><b>Maybe</b> I won't go back.</i>
<b>preconception</b>	An opinion formed beforehand without adequate evidence. <i>He did not even try to confirm his <b>preconceptions</b>.</i>
<b>predict</b>	Make a prediction about; tell in advance. <i>It is too early to <b>predict</b> a result.</i>
<b>presume</b>	Constitute reasonable evidence for. <i>Forgive me if I have <b>presumed</b>.</i>
<b>prognosticate</b>	Make a prediction about; tell in advance. <i>The economists were prognosticating financial Armageddon.</i>
<b>prophecy</b>	Predict or reveal through, or as if through, divine inspiration. <i>Jacques was <b>prophesying</b> a bumper harvest.</i>
<b>speculation</b>	An investment that is very risky but could yield great profits. <i>The company's move into property <b>speculation</b>.</i>
<b>suppose</b>	Expect, believe, or suppose. <i><b>Suppose</b> he had been murdered what then.</i>
<b>supposition</b>	A belief held without proof or certain knowledge; an assumption or hypothesis. <i>They were working on the <b>supposition</b> that his death was murder.</i>
<b>surmise</b>	Infer from incomplete evidence. <i>All these observations remain <b>surmise</b>.</i>
