Associations of "Presuppose definition" (30 Words)

anticipate	Look forward to. <i>It was anticipated that the rains would slow the military campaign.</i>
anticipation	The action of anticipating something; expectation or prediction. <i>Each of them had their own anticipations.</i>
anticipatory	(of a breach of contract) taking the form of an announcement or indication that a contract will not be honoured. <i>An anticipatory flash of excitement.</i>
aspirant	An ambitious and aspiring young person. <i>An aspirant to the throne.</i>
aspiring	Directing one’s hopes or ambitions towards becoming a specified type of person. <i>An aspiring artist.</i>
assume	Take on a certain form, attribute, or aspect. <i>She assumed strange manners.</i>
assumption	The act of assuming or taking for granted. <i>Any society is built upon certain assumptions.</i>
astrologer	A person who uses astrology to tell others about their character or to predict their future. <i>He was advised by astrologers to delay his departure.</i>
conjecture	Form an opinion or supposition about (something) on the basis of incomplete information. <i>A matter for conjecture.</i>
envisage	Contemplate or conceive of as a possibility or a desirable future event. <i>The Rome Treaty envisaged free movement across frontiers.</i>
expect	Consider obligatory request and expect. <i>I m expecting a full explanation as to why these files were destroyed.</i>
expectancy	Something expected (as on the basis of a norm). <i>An indicator of expectancy in development.</i>

expectation	Belief about (or mental picture of) the future. <i>I sat down in expectation of a feast of nostalgia.</i>
forebode	Make a prediction about; tell in advance. <i>This lull foreboded some new assault upon him.</i>
forecast	Judge to be probable. <i>Rain is forecast for Scotland.</i>
forecasting	A statement made about the future.
foresee	Act in advance of; deal with ahead of time. <i>It is impossible to foresee how life will work out.</i>
foretell	Foreshadow or presage. <i>A seer had foretold that the earl would assume the throne.</i>
guess	An estimate or conclusion formed by guessing. <i>He took her aside and I guessed that he was offering her a job.</i>
guesswork	The process or results of guessing. <i>Answering this question will involve you in a certain amount of guesswork.</i>
maybe	A mere possibility or probability. <i>Maybe I won't go back.</i>
preconception	An opinion formed beforehand without adequate evidence. <i>He did not even try to confirm his preconceptions.</i>
predict	Make a prediction about; tell in advance. <i>It is too early to predict a result.</i>
presume	Constitute reasonable evidence for. <i>Forgive me if I have presumed.</i>
prognosticate	Make a prediction about; tell in advance. <i>The economists were prognosticating financial Armageddon.</i>
prophecy	Predict or reveal through, or as if through, divine inspiration. <i>Jacques was prophesying a bumper harvest.</i>
speculation	An investment that is very risky but could yield great profits. <i>The company's move into property speculation.</i>
suppose	Expect, believe or suppose. <i>Suppose he had been murdered what then.</i>
supposition	A belief held without proof or certain knowledge; an assumption or hypothesis. <i>They were working on the supposition that his death was murder.</i>
surmise	Infer from incomplete evidence. <i>All these observations remain surmise.</i>
