abundance	(chemistry) the ratio of the total mass of an element in the earth’s crust to the total mass of the earth’s crust; expressed as a percentage or in parts per million. <i>An age of abundance.</i>
affluent	An affluent person a person who is financially well off. <i>The so called emerging affluents.</i>
appreciably	To a noticeable degree. <i>An appreciably higher risk.</i>
bevy	A group of roe deer, quails, or larks. <i>A bevy of young beach boys swarmed around him.</i>
bounty	The property of copious abundance. <i>For millennia the people along the Nile have depended entirely on its bounty.</i>
considerably	To a great extent or degree. <i>Things have improved considerably over the last few years.</i>
countless	Too many to be counted; very many. <i>She d apologized countless times before.</i>
enough	An adequate quantity a quantity that is large enough to achieve a purpose. <i>Have I eaten enough.</i>
fairly	Actually (used to emphasize something surprising or extreme). <i>They played fairly.</i>
galore	In great numbers. <i>There were prizes galore for everything.</i>
greatly	To an extraordinary extent or degree. <i>They now have greatly increased powers.</i>
highly	At a high rate or wage. <i>His colleagues think very highly of him.</i>

incalculable	Too much to be measured. Incalculable riches.
lot	A plot of land assigned for sale or for a particular use. <i>A fenced off back lot.</i>
many	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by `as' or `too' or `so' or `that'; amounting to a large but indefinite number. <i>The temptations are many.</i>
more	Forming the comparative of adjectives and adverbs especially those of more than one syllable. More land.
multiplicity	A large number or variety. <i>The demand for higher education depends on a multiplicity of factors.</i>
myriad	A large indefinite number. <i>The army was organized on a decimal system up to divisions of 10 000 or myriads.</i>
numerous	Consisting of many members. <i>The family was numerous.</i>
outnumber	Be more numerous than. <i>Women outnumbered men by three to one.</i>
plentiful	Existing in or yielding great quantities; abundant. <i>Rhinoceroses were once plentiful here.</i>
plenty	A situation in which food and other necessities are available in sufficiently large quantities. <i>I ve had plenty thanks.</i>
profusion	An abundance or large quantity of something. <i>A rich profusion of flowers.</i>
quite	To a certain or fairly significant extent or degree; fairly. Quite a walk.
ravishing	Delightful; entrancing. <i>A ravishing blonde.</i>
reasonably	Inexpensively. <i>Acted quite reasonably.</i>
richness	Splendid or imposing in size or appearance. <i>The richness and diversity of human culture.</i>
substantially	In a strong substantial way. <i>Things will remain substantially the same over the next ten years.</i>

untold Too much or too many to be counted or measured.
