deservedly	As deserved. <i>A deservedly popular sitcom.</i>
deserving	Worthy of being treated in a particular way (often used ironically). <i>The deserving poor.</i>
donate	Allow the removal of (blood or an organ) from one's body for transplantation, transfusion, or research. <i>She donates to her favorite charity every month.</i>
gem	Used in names of some brilliantly coloured hummingbirds e.g mountain gem. <i>This architectural gem of a palace.</i>
gemstone	A precious or semi-precious stone, especially one cut, polished, and used in a piece of jewellery.
heirloom	Denoting a traditional variety of plant or breed of animal which is not associated with large-scale commercial agriculture. <i>The violin was a family heirloom.</i>
invaluable	Having incalculable monetary, intellectual, or spiritual worth. <i>An invaluable source of information.</i>

jewel	A person who is as brilliant and precious as a piece of jewelry. <i>She loved dressing up in her jewels.</i>
jewellery	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems). <i>A jewellery box.</i>
laudable	(of an action, idea, or aim) deserving praise and commendation. <i>Laudable though the aim might be the results have been criticized.</i>
merit	The intrinsic rights and wrongs of a case, outside of any other considerations. <i>A plaintiff who has a good arguable case on the merits.</i>
merited	Properly deserved. <i>A merited success.</i>
praiseworthy	Deserving approval and admiration. <i>The government's praiseworthy efforts.</i>
precious	Characterized by feeling or showing fond affection for. <i>Don't be frightened my precious.</i>
respectable	Large in amount or extent or degree. <i>They thought the stage no life for a respectable lady.</i>
rhinestone	An imitation diamond made from rock crystal or glass or paste. <i>Rhinestone earrings.</i>
treasure	Hold dear. <i>The children returned from the seashore with their shells and other treasures.</i>
valuable	Having worth or merit or value. <i>Put all your valuables in the hotel safe.</i>
value	Estimate the value of. <i>The mean value of x.</i>
valued	Having value of a specified kind. <i>A valued friend.</i>
worthiness	The quality or state of having merit or value. <i>An argument about the moral worthiness of the nation's founders.</i>
worthy	Worthy of being chosen especially as a spouse. <i>Worthy but tedious advice.</i>
