### Definitions of "Privacy" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “privacy” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A state in which one is not observed or disturbed by other people.*
- *The state of being free from public attention.*
- *The quality of being secluded from the presence or view of others.*
- *The condition of being concealed or hidden.*



## Synonyms of "Privacy" as a noun (14 Words)

<b>concealment</b>	The action of hiding something or preventing it from being known. <i>The <b>concealment</b> of the weapons.</i>
<b>freedom from interference</b>	Immunity from an obligation or duty.
<b><u>isolation</u></b>	A defense mechanism in which memory of an unacceptable act or impulse is separated from the emotion originally associated with it. <i>He opposed a policy of American <b>isolation</b>.</i>
<b>lack of disturbance</b>	The state of needing something that is absent or unavailable.
<b>lack of interruption</b>	The state of needing something that is absent or unavailable.
<b>peace</b>	A treaty agreeing peace between warring states. <i>Support for a negotiated <b>peace</b>.</i>
<b>peace and quiet</b>	The absence of mental stress or anxiety.

**peacefulness**

The absence of mental stress or anxiety.

**privateness**

The quality of being secluded from the presence or view of others.

**quietness**

A state of peace and quiet.

*A voice disturbed the **quietness** of the night.*

**retirement**

The period of time during which a jury decides their verdict.

*A three hour **retirement**.*

**seclusion**

The state of being private and away from other people.

*They enjoyed ten days of peace and **seclusion**.*

[secrecy](#)

The action of keeping something secret or the state of being kept secret.

*The bidding is conducted in **secrecy**.*

[solitude](#)

A lonely or uninhabited place.

*She savoured her few hours of freedom and **solitude**.*



## Usage Examples of "Privacy" as a noun

- *She returned to the privacy of her own home.*



- A law to restrict newspapers' freedom to invade people's privacy.



## Associations of "Privacy" (30 Words)

<b>alone</b>	Exclusive of anyone or anything else. <i>Cannot live by bread <b>alone</b>.</i>
<b>clandestine</b>	Kept secret or done secretly, especially because illicit. <i><b>Clandestine</b> intelligence operations.</i>
<b>cloistered</b>	Enclosed by or having a cloister. <i>A <b>cloistered</b> upbringing.</i>
<b><u>forlorn</u></b>	Pitifully sad and abandoned or lonely. <i>The last <b>forlorn</b> attempt.</i>
<b><u>hermit</u></b>	A person living in solitude as a religious discipline.
<b>hide</b>	Prevent from being seen or discovered. <i>Juliet's first instinct was to <b>hide</b> under the blankets.</i>

<b>individual</b>	Characteristic of or meant for a single person or thing. <i>She creates her own highly <b>individual</b> landscapes.</i>
<b>isolate</b>	A person or thing that has been or become isolated. <i>The chemist managed to <b>isolate</b> the compound.</i>
<b>isolated</b>	Being or feeling set or kept apart from others- Sherwood Anderson. <i>He lived a very <b>isolated</b> existence.</i>
<b><u>isolation</u></b>	The act of isolating something; setting something apart from others. <i>He opposed a policy of American <b>isolation</b>.</i>
<b><u>lone</u></b>	(of a place) unfrequented and remote. <i>A <b>lone</b>ly existence.</i>
<b>loneliness</b>	The fact of being without companions; solitariness. <i>The <b>loneliness</b> of the farm.</i>
<b>lonely</b>	Without companions; solitary. <i>Felt sad and <b>lonely</b>.</i>
<b>lonesome</b>	Being the only one; single and isolated from others. <i>She felt <b>lonesome</b> and out of things.</i>
<b>personal</b>	Existing as a self aware entity not as an abstraction or an impersonal force. <i>A <b>personal</b> God.</i>
<b><u>recluse</u></b>	Favouring a solitary life. <i>He s a bit of a <b>recluse</b>.</i>
<b><u>remote</u></b>	A remote control device. <i>A <b>remote</b> possibility.</i>
<b>seclude</b>	Keep away from others. <i>I <b>secluded</b> myself up here for a life of study and meditation.</i>
<b><u>secluded</u></b>	(of a place) not seen or visited by many people; sheltered and private. <i>A <b>secluded</b> romantic spot.</i>
<b>seclusion</b>	A sheltered or private place. <i>They enjoyed ten days of peace and <b>seclusion</b>.</i>
<b><u>secrecy</u></b>	The condition of being concealed or hidden. <i>The bidding is conducted in <b>secrecy</b>.</i>
<b><u>sequester</u></b>	Isolate or hide away. <i>The cations were <b>sequestered</b>.</i>
<b><u>sole</u></b>	Put a new sole on to a shoe. <i>The <b>sole</b> example.</i>
<b><u>solitary</u></b>	Being the only one; single and isolated from others. <i>I live a pretty <b>solitary</b> life.</i>

- solitude** The state or situation of being alone.  
*She savoured her few hours of freedom and **solitude**.*
- troglodyte** One who lives in solitude.  
Not likely to be rewarded.
- unappreciated** *She had been brought up in a family where she felt **unappreciated** and undervalued.*
- unrewarding** Not rewarding or satisfying.  
*It was dull **unrewarding** work.*
- unsung** Having value that is not acknowledged.  
***Unsung** heroes of the war.*
- withdrawn** Withdrawn from society seeking solitude.  
*When her husband died she became very **withdrawn**.*
