adept	A person who is skilled or proficient at something. <i>He is an adept at imitation.</i>
authority	Freedom from doubt; belief in yourself and your abilities. <i>A rebellion against those in authority.</i>
expert	A person with special knowledge or ability who performs skillfully. <i>A financial expert.</i>
maestro	A distinguished figure in any sphere. <i>A Vietnam vet turned movie maestro.</i>
master	Someone who holds a master's degree from academic institution. <i>He was master of the situation.</i>
old hand	Past times (especially in the phrase 'in days of old).
past master	A earlier period in someone's life (especially one that they have reason to keep secret).

professional A person engaged in one of the learned professions.
*His first season as a **professional**.*

professional player An authority qualified to teach apprentices.

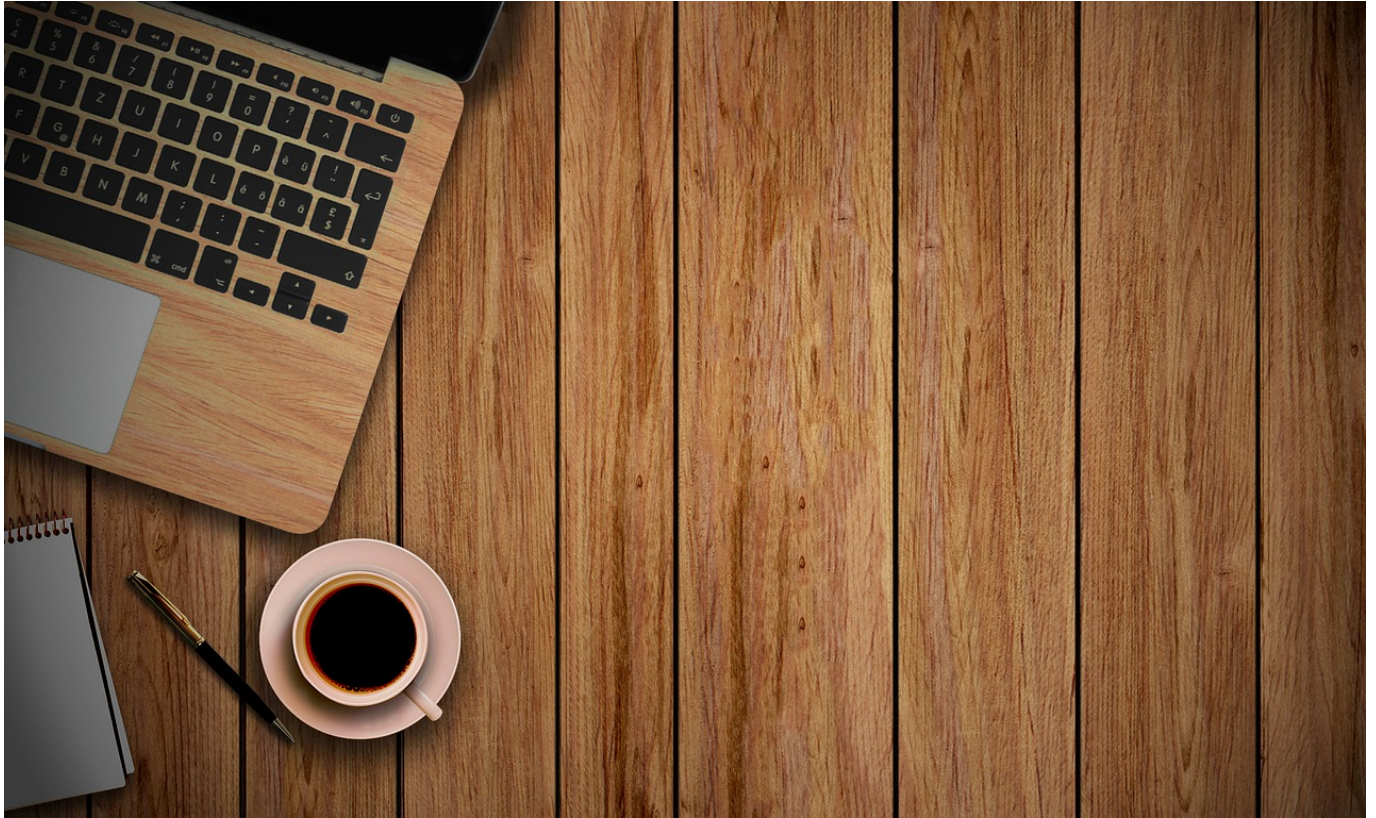
trooper A reliable and uncomplaining person.
*He was a real **trooper** for going on while he was feeling less than his best.*

virtuoso A musician who is a consummate master of technique and artistry.
***Virtuoso** guitar playing.*

Definitions of "Pro" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "pro" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a person or an event) professional.*
- *In favor of (an action or proposal etc).*



Synonyms of "Pro" as an adjective (3 Words)

- approving** Showing or feeling approval of someone or something.
*The wine drew **approving** comments from across the table.*
- in favour** Currently fashionable.
- on the side of** Located on a side.



Usage Examples of "Pro" as an adjective

- *A pro golfer.*



Associations of "Pro" (30 Words)

- advantage** Give an advantage to.
*It turned out to my **advantage**.*
- backwards** At or to or toward the back or rear.
*Count **backwards** from twenty to ten.*
- behalf** For someone's benefit usually expressed as in behalf rather than on behalf and usually with a possessive.
*Campaigning in his own **behalf**.*
- benefit** Derive a benefit from.
*For the **benefit** of all.*
- best** (superlative of `good') having the most positive qualities.
*They did their **best**.*

better	Comparative of well in a better or more excellent manner or more advantageously or attractively or to a greater degree etc. <i>A change for the better.</i>
boon	Very close and convivial. <i>A spanking breeze is a boon to sailors.</i>
downside	The negative aspect of something otherwise regarded as good or desirable. <i>There is a downside even to motherhood.</i>
excellent	Very good; of the highest quality. <i>Made an excellent speech.</i>
favorite	Preferred above all others and treated with partiality. <i>That book is one of my favorites.</i>
good	In a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>A good quality of life.</i>
indulging	The act of indulging or gratifying a desire.
like	Feel about or towards; consider, evaluate, or regard. <i>Would you like to come along to the movies.</i>
moll	The girlfriend of a gangster. <i>I'd rush the money over to his moll.</i>
perquisite	A thing which has served its primary use and to which a subordinate or employee has a customary right. <i>The perquisites of celebrity are intoxicating.</i>
plus	Involving advantage or good. <i>B plus.</i>
positive	A positive photographic image especially one printed from a negative. <i>A positive test for Down's syndrome.</i>
predilection	A preference or special liking for something; a bias in favour of something. <i>My predilection for Asian food.</i>
preeminence	High status importance owing to marked superiority.
prefer	Give preference to one creditor over another. <i>The police will prefer charges.</i>
prerogative	Arising from the prerogative of the Crown usually delegated to the government or the judiciary and based in common law rather than statutory law. <i>Suffrage was the prerogative of white adult males.</i>
privilege	Bestow a privilege upon. <i>He has been accustomed all his life to wealth and privilege.</i>

profiteer	A person who profiteers. <i>Officials have been profiteering by selling communal land to developers.</i>
sideways	Directed or moving to, towards, or from the side. <i>He would be moved sideways rather than demoted.</i>
superb	Used in names of birds with attractive or colourful plumage e.g. superb lyrebird. <i>A superb actor.</i>
tout	Sell (a ticket) for an event at a price higher than the official one. <i>This product was touted as a revolutionary invention.</i>
unmatched	Of the remaining member of a pair. <i>He has a talent unmatched by any other politician.</i>
upside	The highest or uppermost side of anything. <i>Being self-employed has its upside.</i>
value	Estimate the value of. <i>Equipment is included up to a total value of 500.</i>
worthwhile	Worth the time, money, or effort spent; of value or importance. <i>Extra lighting would make a worthwhile contribution to road safety.</i>
