- Apparently destined.
- Likely but not certain to be or become true or real.
- Likely to happen or be the case.





## Synonyms of "Probable" as an adjective (12 Words)

anticipated Expected hopefully.

<u>credible</u>	Credulous. Completely <b>credible</b> testimony.
<u>expected</u>	Considered likely or probable to happen or arrive. The <b>expected</b> high temperatures are well above normal for this time of year.
feasible	Likely; probable. The most <b>feasible</b> explanation.
foreseeable	Capable of being anticipated. <i>The situation is unlikely to change in the <b>foreseeable</b> future.</i>
likely	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. A <b>likely</b> topic for investigation.
most likely	Quantifier meaning the greatest in number.
odds-on	Having a better than even chance of success.
<u>possible</u>	Having as much or as little of a specified quality as can be achieved. It is <b>possible</b> that he will have to return to hospital.
potential	Existing in possibility. A <b>potential</b> problem.



#### **predictable** Able to be predicted. *The market is volatile and never* **predictable**.

#### ten to one Being one more than nine.



## Usage Examples of "Probable" as an adjective

- The probable consequences of going ahead with the scheme.
- It is probable that the economic situation will deteriorate further.
- The probable consequences of his action.
- He foresaw a probable loss.





# Associations of "Probable" (30 Words)

<u>able</u>	Having considerable skill proficiency or intelligence. <i>Human beings are <b>able</b> to walk on two feet.</i>
arguable	Able to be argued or asserted. A highly <b>arguable</b> assumption.
<u>believable</u>	Capable of being believed. A drama that lacks <b>believable</b> characters.
<u>bound</u>	Headed or intending to head in a certain direction often used as a combining form as in college bound students. What he did was beyond the <b>bounds</b> of acceptable behavior.
chance	Occurring or appearing or singled out by chance. I gave her a <b>chance</b> to answer.



connection	(usually plural) a person who is influential and to whom you are connected in some way (as by family or friendship. <i>The plane was late and he missed his connection in Atlanta.</i>
<u>credible</u>	Appearing to merit belief or acceptance. <i>Few people found his story <b>credible</b></i> .
<u>likelihood</u>	The state or fact of something's being likely; probability. Young people who can see no <b>likelihood</b> of finding employment.
likely	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i>Likely</i> candidates for the job.
odds	The balance of advantage; superiority in strength, power, or resources. <i>He offered <b>odds</b> of two to one.</i>
opportunity	A time or set of circumstances that makes it possible to do something. The night drive gave us the <b>opportunity</b> of spotting rhinos.
percent	A proportion in relation to a whole (which is usually the amount per hundred.
percentage	Personal benefit or advantage. I hope to be on a <b>percentage</b> .
plausible	Apparently reasonable and credible, and therefore convincing. It seems <b>plausible</b> that one of two things may happen.
possibility	A thing that may be chosen or done out of several possible alternatives. There is no <b>possibility</b> of any government achieving this level of expenditure.
<u>possible</u>	The highest possible score especially in a shooting competition. <b>Possible</b> uses of nuclear power.
potential	Having or showing the capacity to develop into something in the future. <i>A campaign to woo <b>potential</b> customers.</i>
potentiality	Latent qualities or abilities that may be developed and lead to future success or usefulness. <i>The technology is still relatively not well known in spite of its great</i> <b>potentiality</b> .
presumable	Capable of being inferred on slight grounds.
presumptive	Giving grounds for the inference of a fact or of the appropriate interpretation of the law. <i>A strong <b>presumptive</b> case is made out.</i>
<u>probability</u>	The quality of being probable; a probable event or the most probable event. <i>For a time revolution was a strong <b>probability</b>.</i>



<u>probably</u>	Almost certainly; as far as one knows or can tell. <i>He is <b>probably</b> out of the country.</i>
prospect	The possibility or likelihood of some future event occurring. <i>Norwich s unbeaten heavyweight prospect.</i>
prospective	Likely to happen at a future date. <b>Prospective</b> earnings.
scientifically	In a way that relates to or is used in science. <i>Scientifically</i> minded people.
<u>seem</u>	Seem to be true probable or apparent. I <b>seem</b> to remember giving you very precise instructions.
<u>tend</u>	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>The orbit</i> <b>tend</b> s to infinity.
<u>tied</u>	(of aid or an international loan) given subject to the condition that it should be spent on goods or services from the donor or lender. <i>A neatly tied package.</i>
trammel	An adjustable pothook set in a fireplace. We have no wish to be <b>trammel</b> led by convention.
<u>volition</u>	The act of making a choice. <i>The exercise of their volition we construe as revolt.</i>
