**doubtless** The company would **doubtless** find the reduced competition to

their liking.

in all likelihoodin all probabilityTo or toward the inside of.

likely Probably.

We will most **likely** go to a bar.

maybe Perhaps; possibly.

He was standing **maybe** 20 or 30 feet away.

**most likely** Used to form the superlative.

**no doubt** Referring to the degree to which a certain quality is present.

Used to express uncertainty or possibility.

**perhaps** not surprisingly he was cautious about committing

himself.

plausibly

In a way that seems reasonable or probable.

Both candidates can **plausibly** claim victory is within their reach.

In accordance with what is likely or achievable.

What can you **possibly** mean.

By reasonable assumption.

**presumably** It was not yet ten o clock so **presumably** the boys were still at the

pub.

**very likely** Precisely so.
