Synonyms of "Professor" as a noun (13 Words)

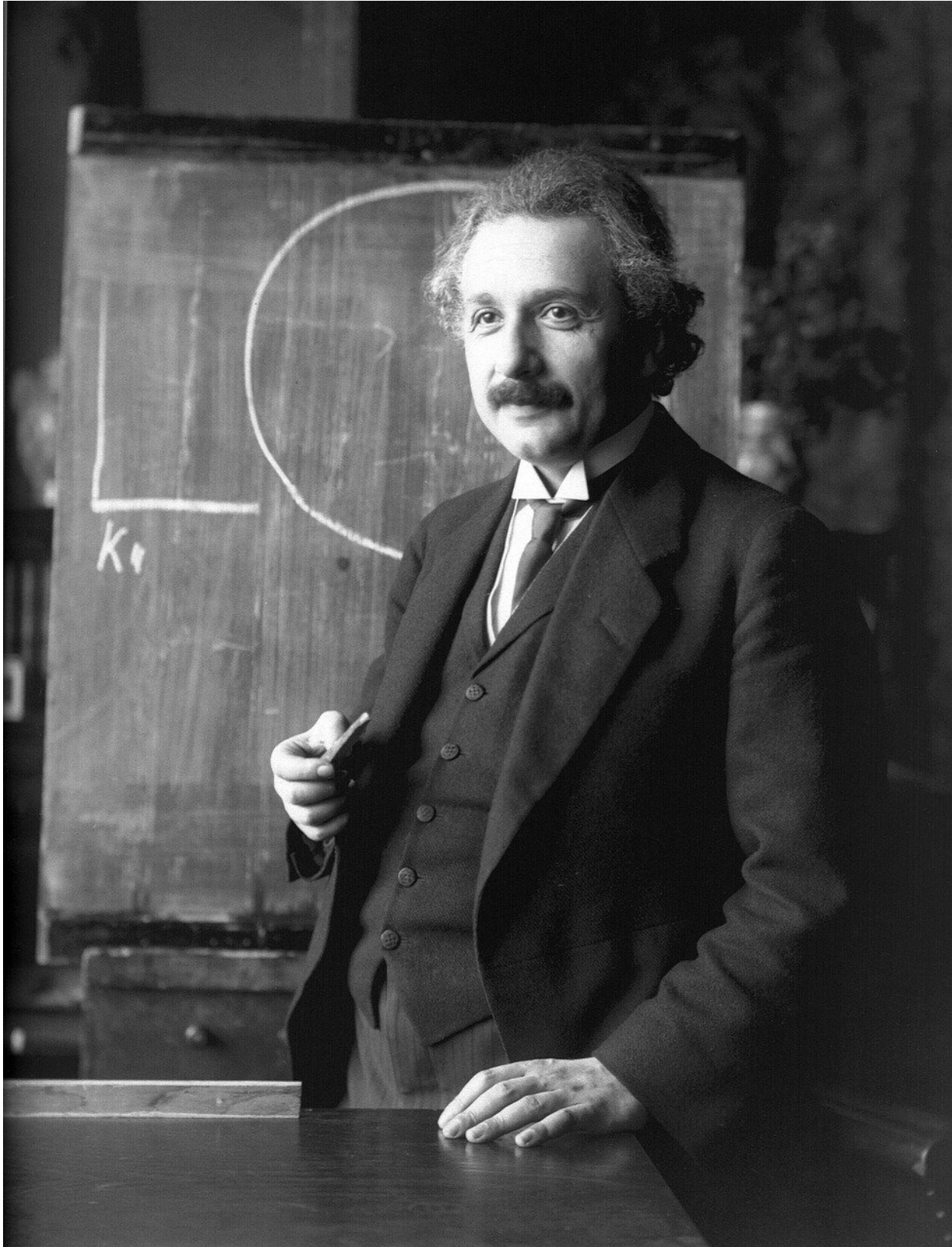
adviser	A person who gives advice in a particular field. <i>An adviser helped students select their courses.</i>
<u>chair</u>	The person in charge of a meeting or of an organization used as a neutral alternative to chairman or chairwoman. <i>He put his coat over the back of the chair and sat down.</i>
coach	A vehicle carrying many passengers; used for public transport. <i>A coach trip.</i>
counsellor	A person who gives advice on a specified subject. <i>A marriage counsellor.</i>
demonstrator	A participant in a public protest meeting or march. <i>The demonstrators arrived and launched into a two hour sales pitch.</i>
guide	A member of the Guide Association. <i>His spiritual guide.</i>

head of department	The obverse side of a coin that usually bears the representation of a person's head.
head of faculty	The obverse side of a coin that usually bears the representation of a person's head.
holder of a chair	The person who is in possession of a check or note or bond or document of title that is endorsed to him or to whoever holds it.
prof	A professor. <i>You heard what the prof said.</i>
<u>teacher</u>	A person who teaches, especially in a school. <i>Experience is a demanding teacher.</i>
trainer	A person who trains people or animals. <i>A fitness trainer.</i>
<u>tutor</u>	A private teacher, typically one who teaches a single pupil or a very small group. <i>Tutor to the Prince of Wales.</i>

Associations of "Professor" (30 Words)

<u>absenteeism</u>	The practice of regularly staying away from work or school without good reason. <i>High levels of absenteeism caused by low job motivation.</i>
<u>academy</u>	A society or institution of distinguished scholars and artists or scientists that aims to promote and maintain standards in its particular field. <i>A police academy.</i>
<u>admirer</u>	A person who has a sexual or romantic interest in someone. <i>She s got a secret admirer.</i>
assistant	A person who ranks below a senior person. <i>An assistant manager.</i>
attendance	The number of people present at a particular place or event. <i>My attendance at church was very patchy.</i>
bursar	A student who holds a bursary.
<u>campus</u>	The grounds and buildings of a university or college. <i>For the first year I had a room on campus.</i>
collegian	A member of a college, especially within a university.
<u>disciple</u>	A follower or pupil of a teacher, leader, or philosopher. <i>A disciple of Rousseau.</i>
education	The United States federal department that administers all federal programs dealing with education including federal aid to educational institutions and students created 1979. <i>Health education.</i>
emeritus	Honorably retired from assigned duties and retaining your title along with the additional title emeritus as in professor emeritus. <i>The National Gallery s director emeritus.</i>
examiner	Someone who administers a test to determine your qualifications. <i>Exams are marked by external examiners.</i>
grad	A person who has received a degree from a school (high school or college or university).
<u>graduate</u>	A graduated cup tube flask or measuring glass used especially by chemists and pharmacists. <i>The stones were graduated in height from the lowest near the entrance to the tallest opposite.</i>
graduated	Arranged in a series or according to a scale. <i>A graduated tax.</i>

<u>guru</u>	A Hindu spiritual teacher. <i>A management guru.</i>
homeroom	A classroom in which all students in a particular grade (or in a division of a grade) meet at certain times under the supervision of a teacher who takes attendance and does other administrative business.
informational	Relating to or having the nature of information. <i>An informational brochure.</i>
lecturer	A public lecturer at certain universities. <i>A senior lecturer in surgery at Leeds University.</i>
matriculate	A person who has matriculated. <i>He was matriculated at Balliol College Oxford.</i>
pupil	A trainee barrister. <i>Will you take me on as your pupil.</i>
researcher	A scientist who devotes himself to doing research. <i>A medical researcher who pioneered the development of antibiotics.</i>
<u>scholar</u>	A student who holds a scholarship. <i>A Hebrew scholar.</i>
schoolgirl	Characteristic of or associated with schoolgirls. <i>Schoolgirl French.</i>
student	A school pupil. <i>High school students.</i>
teach	A teacher. <i>She teaches at the local high school.</i>
<u>tutor</u>	Act as a tutor to a single pupil or a very small group. <i>Tutor to the Prince of Wales.</i>
undergraduate	Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. <i>Undergraduate students.</i>
<u>university</u>	The body of faculty and students at a university. <i>His daughter is at university.</i>
valedictorian	(in North America) a student who delivers the valedictory at a graduation ceremony.
