remunerative	Earning a salary; paid. <i>Remunerative</i> work.
<u>solvent</u>	Capable of meeting financial obligations. Interest rate rises have very severe effects on normally solvent companies.
sound	In good condition; free from defect or damage or decay. A sound argument.
successful	Having succeeded or being marked by a favorable outcome. Marketing of Japanese products has been highly successful .
useful	Having a useful function. Aspirins are useful for headaches.
valuable	Having worth or merit or value. My time is valuable .
<u>worthwhile</u>	Sufficiently valuable to justify the investment of time or interest. A worthwhile book.
