beneficial	Relating to rights to the use or benefit of property, other than legal title. <i>The beneficial effects of a temperate climate.</i>
commercial	Of or relating to commercialism. <i>Commercial TV.</i>
cost-effective	Productive relative to the cost.
fruitful	(of a tree, plant, or land) producing much fruit; fertile. <i>Memoirs can be a fruitful source of information.</i>
gainful	Yielding a fair profit. <i>He soon found gainful employment.</i>
helpful	Useful. <i>Helpful staff.</i>
in the black	Currently fashionable.

lucrative	Producing a great deal of profit. <i>A lucrative career as a stand up comedian.</i>
moneymaking	Producing a profit, especially with little effort; profitable. <i>He hit on an unusual moneymaking scheme.</i>
paying	For which money is paid. <i>A paying job.</i>
productive	(of a prefix, suffix, or other linguistic unit) currently used in forming new words or expressions. <i>A productive vineyard.</i>
remunerative	Earning a salary; paid. <i>Remunerative work.</i>
solvent	Capable of meeting financial obligations. <i>Interest rate rises have very severe effects on normally solvent companies.</i>
sound	In good condition; free from defect or damage or decay. <i>A sound argument.</i>
successful	Having succeeded or being marked by a favorable outcome. <i>Marketing of Japanese products has been highly successful.</i>
useful	Having a useful function. <i>Aspirins are useful for headaches.</i>
valuable	Having worth or merit or value. <i>My time is valuable.</i>
worthwhile	Sufficiently valuable to justify the investment of time or interest. <i>A worthwhile book.</i>

helpful	Giving or ready to give help. <i>Pages of helpful information.</i>
immensely	To an exceedingly great extent or degree. <i>The president was immensely popular.</i>
immensity	Unusual largeness in size or extent or number. <i>I have no illusions about the immensity of this task.</i>
industrialist	A person involved in the ownership and management of industry. <i>The exploitation of child labour by nineteenth century industrialists.</i>
lucrative	Producing a great deal of profit. <i>A lucrative career as a stand up comedian.</i>
palmy	(especially of a previous period) flourishing or successful. <i>A conference centre set among palmy trails.</i>
paying	For which money is paid. <i>A paying job.</i>
productive	(of a prefix, suffix, or other linguistic unit) currently used in forming new words or expressions. <i>His productive years.</i>
prolific	(of a sports player) high-scoring. <i>A prolific writer.</i>

<u>propitious</u>	Giving or indicating a good chance of success; favourable. <i>Propitious gales speeded us along.</i>
prosperous	Presaging or likely to bring good luck or a good outcome. <i>A prosperous moment to make a decision.</i>
remunerative	For which money is paid. <i>Highly remunerative activities.</i>
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>A rich and hoppy best bitter.</i>
sinecure	An office that involves minimal duties. <i>Political sinecures for the supporters of ministers.</i>
successful	Having succeeded or being marked by a favorable outcome. <i>A successful business venture.</i>
<u>taking</u>	The action or process of taking something. <i>He was not a very taking person she felt.</i>
thriving	Prosperous and growing; flourishing. <i>Did a thriving business in orchids.</i>
winning	Succeeding with great difficulty. <i>The winning team.</i>
