<b>moneymaking</b>	Producing a profit, especially with little effort; profitable. <i>He hit on an unusual <b>moneymaking</b> scheme.</i>
<b>paying</b>	For which money is paid. <i>A <b>paying</b> job.</i>
<b>productive</b>	(of a prefix, suffix, or other linguistic unit) currently used in forming new words or expressions. <i>A <b>productive</b> vineyard.</i>
<b>remunerative</b>	Earning a salary; paid. <i><b>Remunerative</b> work.</i>
<b>solvent</b>	Capable of meeting financial obligations. <i>Interest rate rises have very severe effects on normally <b>solvent</b> companies.</i>
<b>sound</b>	In good condition; free from defect or damage or decay. <i>A <b>sound</b> argument.</i>
<b>successful</b>	Having succeeded or being marked by a favorable outcome. <i>Marketing of Japanese products has been highly <b>successful</b>.</i>
<b>useful</b>	Having a useful function. <i>Aspirins are <b>useful</b> for headaches.</i>
<b>valuable</b>	Having worth or merit or value. <i>My time is <b>valuable</b>.</i>
<b>worthwhile</b>	Sufficiently valuable to justify the investment of time or interest. <i>A <b>worthwhile</b> book.</i>

<b>rich</b>	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>A rich and hoppy best bitter.</i>
<b>sinecure</b>	An office that involves minimal duties. <i>Political sinecures for the supporters of ministers.</i>
