Completely and absolutely good is sometimes used informally for

thoroughly. thoroughly

We searched the files **thoroughly**.

Extremely. tremendously

Daniel played **tremendously** throughout.

Used as intensifiers; 'real' is sometimes used informally for 'really';

`rattling' is informal. very

The river rose **very** quickly.
