Definitions of "Profusely" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “profusely” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In an abundant manner.*
- *To a great degree; in large amounts.*



Synonyms of "Profusely" as an adverb (3 Words)

- abundantly** In large quantities; plentifully.
*The plant grows **abundantly** in the wild.*
- copiously** In an abundant manner.
*His book is **copiously** annotated with references to the current debates.*
- extravagantly** In a rich and lavish manner.
*As a child Mozart was **extravagantly** praised.*



Usage Examples of "Profusely" as an adverb

- *A man bleeding profusely from a head wound.*
- *The book is profusely illustrated with period photos.*
- *The waiter was profusely apologetic.*
- *He thanked her profusely.*

abundant	Existing or available in large quantities; plentiful. <i>An abundant supply of water.</i>
abundantly	Extremely. <i>The plant grows abundantly in the wild.</i>
affluent	An affluent person a person who is financially well off. <i>An affluent banker.</i>
ample	Affording an abundant supply. <i>There is ample time for discussion.</i>
armful	The quantity that can be contained in the arms. <i>Most of us will end up with armfuls of stuff we do not need.</i>
bountiful	Large in quantity; abundant. <i>The bountiful earth.</i>
bountifulness	The property of copious abundance.

bounty	Something given or occurring in generous amounts. <i>For millennia the people along the Nile have depended entirely on its bounty.</i>
copious	Large in number or quantity (especially of discourse). <i>Copious provisions.</i>
fecundation	Creation by the physical union of male and female gametes; of sperm and ova in an animal or pollen and ovule in a plant.
fertility	The property of producing abundantly and sustaining vigorous and luxuriant growth. <i>Anxiety and stress affect fertility in both men and women.</i>
galore	Existing in abundance. <i>There were prizes galore for everything.</i>
lavishly	In a sumptuously rich, elaborate, or luxurious manner. <i>A lavishly decorated room.</i>
lot	A plot of land assigned for sale or for a particular use. <i>They drew lots for it.</i>
luxuriant	Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses. <i>Forests of dark luxuriant foliage.</i>
luxurious	Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses. <i>The island s most luxurious hotel.</i>
many	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by `as' or `too' or `so' or `that'; amounting to a large but indefinite number. <i>The job of government is to help order society in the interests of the many not the few.</i>
mellowness	A soft shade of a color. <i>A mellowness of light and shade not attainable in marble.</i>
opulent	Rich and superior in quality. <i>The opulent comfort of a limousine.</i>
outnumber	Be more numerous than. <i>Women outnumbered men by three to one.</i>
plenitude	The condition of being full or complete. <i>The plenitude of the Pope s powers.</i>
plenteous	Plentiful. <i>The meal was astonishingly plenteous.</i>
plentiful	Producing in abundance. <i>Food is plentiful.</i>
plentitude	A full supply.

- plenty** (often followed by `of') a large number or amount or extent.
*I've had **plenty** thanks.*
- profusion** An abundance or large quantity of something.
*A rich **profusion** of flowers.*
- prosperity** The condition of prospering; having good fortune.
*A long period of peace and **prosperity**.*
- replete** (followed by `with') deeply filled or permeated.
*It is **replete** with misery.*
- richness** The property of a sensation that is rich and pleasing.
*He was well aware of the **richness** of his own appearance.*
- voluminous** Marked by repeated turns and bends.
*A **voluminous** purple cloak.*
