






## Usage Examples of "Profusely" as an adverb

# Associations of "Profusely" (30 Words)

abundant	Existing or available in large quantities; plentiful. An <b>abundant</b> supply of water.
abundantly	Extremely. The plant grows <b>abundantly</b> in the wild.
<u>affluent</u>	An affluent person a person who is financially well off. An <b>affluent</b> banker.
ample	Affording an abundant supply. There is <b>ample</b> time for discussion.
armful	The quantity that can be contained in the arms. Most of us will end up with <b>armful</b> s of stuff we do not need.
bountiful	Large in quantity; abundant. The <b>bountiful</b> earth.
bountifulness	The property of copious abundance.



<u>bounty</u>	Something given or occurring in generous amounts. For millennia the people along the Nile have depended entirely on its <b>bounty</b> .
<u>copious</u>	Large in number or quantity (especially of discourse. <i>Copious</i> provisions.
fecundation	Creation by the physical union of male and female gametes; of sperm and ova in an animal or pollen and ovule in a plant.
fertility	The property of producing abundantly and sustaining vigorous and luxuriant growth. Anxiety and stress affect <b>fertility</b> in both men and women.
galore	Existing in abundance. There were prizes <b>galore</b> for everything.
lavishly	In a sumptuously rich, elaborate, or luxurious manner. A <b>lavishly</b> decorated room.
lot	A plot of land assigned for sale or for a particular use. They drew <b>lot</b> s for it.
luxuriant	Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses. Forests of dark <b>luxuriant</b> foliage.
<u>luxurious</u>	Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses. The island s most <b>luxurious</b> hotel.
many	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by `as' or `too' or `so' or `that'; amounting to a large but indefinite number. The job of government is to help order society in the interests of the <b>many</b> not the few.
mellowness	A soft shade of a color. A <b>mellowness</b> of light and shade not attainable in marble.
<u>opulent</u>	Rich and superior in quality. The <b>opulent</b> comfort of a limousine.
outnumber	Be more numerous than. Women <b>outnumber</b> ed men by three to one.
plenitude	The condition of being full or complete. The <b>plenitude</b> of the Pope s powers.
plenteous	Plentiful. The meal was astonishingly <b>plenteous</b> .
plentiful	Producing in abundance. Food is <b>plentiful</b> .
plentitude	A full supply.



<u>plenty</u>	(often followed by `of') a large number or amount or extent. <i>I ve had <b>plenty</b> thanks.</i>
profusion	An abundance or large quantity of something. A rich <b>profusion</b> of flowers.
prosperity	The condition of prospering; having good fortune. A long period of peace and <b>prosperity</b> .
replete	(followed by `with') deeply filled or permeated. It is <b>replete</b> with misery.
richness	The property of a sensation that is rich and pleasing. <i>He was well aware of the <b>richness</b> of his own appearance.</i>
voluminous	Marked by repeated turns and bends. A <b>voluminous</b> purple cloak.
