Definitions of "Progeny" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “progeny” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A descendant or the descendants of a person, animal, or plant; offspring.*
- *The immediate descendants of a person.*



Synonyms of "Progeny" as a noun (12 Words)

brood

A family of birds or other young animals produced at one hatching or birth.
*She was brought up as part of a **brood** of eight.*

children

A young person of either sex.

descendants All of the offspring of a given progenitor.

family

A collection of things sharing a common attribute.
*The **family** lived in a large house with a lot of land.*

heirs

A person who is entitled by law or by the terms of a will to inherit the estate of another.

issue

Supplies as food or clothing or ammunition issued by the government.
*He died without **issue**.*

lineage

The number of lines in a piece of printed material.
*His entire **lineage** has been warriors.*

offspring	The product or result of something. <i>Industrialism prepared the way for acceptance of the French Revolution's various socialistic offspring.</i>
scions	A descendent or heir. <i>A scion of royal stock.</i>
stock	A portion of a company's stock as held by an individual or group as an investment. <i>They will cut round stock to 1 inch diameter.</i>
successors	A person who inherits some title or office. <i>He was President Lincoln's successor.</i>
young	Young people collectively. <i>Many grebes carry their young on their backs.</i>



Usage Examples of "Progeny" as a noun

- *Shorthorn cattle are highly effective in bestowing their characteristics on their progeny.*



Associations of "Progeny" (30 Words)

- beget** Make (offspring) by reproduction.
*They hoped that the King might **beget** an heir by his new queen.*
- caregiver** A person who is responsible for attending to the needs of a child or dependent adult.
- dad** An informal term for a father; probably derived from baby talk.
*His **dad** was with him.*
- daddy** The best or most successful person.
*It s you who s calling the shots now you re the **daddy**.*
- daughter** A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source.
*A **daughter** of the dry savannas of Africa.*
- descendants** All of the offspring of a given progenitor.
- family** A local organizational unit of the Mafia or other large criminal group.
*The **family** lived in a large house with a lot of land.*

father	A male parent also used as a term of address to your father. <i>A collection of Irish stories was fathered on him.</i>
grandchild	A child of one's son or daughter.
grandma	The mother of your father or mother. <i>Grandma didn't stop talking.</i>
grandpa	One's grandfather.
grandparent	A parent of one's father or mother; a grandmother or grandfather. <i>It must be a great blessing to have Chloe's grandparents living nearby.</i>
lineal	Arranged in a line. <i>A lineal descendant.</i>
mom	Informal terms for a mother. <i>My mom gave us each a slice of pizza.</i>
mommy	Informal terms for a mother.
mother	A term of address for a mother superior. <i>Necessity is the mother of invention.</i>
mummy	Informal terms for a mother. <i>The mummy of Tutankhamen.</i>
offspring	Something that comes into existence as a result. <i>She was the mother of many offspring.</i>
parent	Be or act as a parent to a child. <i>Some of the whetstones have been transported up to 400 km from the parent rock.</i>
parental	Denoting an organization or company which owns or controls a number of subsidiaries. <i>Parental leave.</i>
paternal	Related on the father's side. <i>He reasserted his paternal authority.</i>
paternity	The state of being a father. <i>Tests were conducted to determine paternity.</i>
patriarchy	A system of society or government in which men hold the power and women are largely excluded from it. <i>The dominant ideology of patriarchy.</i>
procreate	(of people or animals) produce young; reproduce. <i>The Bible tells people to procreate.</i>
scion	A descendent or heir. <i>He was the scion of a wealthy family.</i>
sibling	A person's brother or sister.

- sister** A black woman (chiefly used as a term of address by other black people).
*The **sisters** announced that there would be a special rosary every morning.*
- sisterhood** The kinship relation between a female offspring and the siblings.
*Canadian feminists acknowledge their **sisterhood** with women around the globe.*
- son** In Christian belief the second person of the Trinity Christ.
*The **sons** of Adam.*
- surname** Give a surname to.
*He changed his **surname** from Kaye to Kasmin.*
