### Definitions of "Progeny" as a noun

- *A descendant or the descendants of a person, animal, or plant; offspring.*
- *The immediate descendants of a person.*



## Synonyms of "Progeny" as a noun (12 Words)

<b>brood</b>	A family of birds or other young animals produced at one hatching or birth. <i>She was brought up as part of a <b>brood</b> of eight.</i>
<b>children</b>	A young person of either sex.
<b>descendants</b>	All of the offspring of a given progenitor.
<b>family</b>	A collection of things sharing a common attribute. <i>The <b>family</b> lived in a large house with a lot of land.</i>
<b>heirs</b>	A person who is entitled by law or by the terms of a will to inherit the estate of another.
<b>issue</b>	Supplies as food or clothing or ammunition issued by the government. <i>He died without <b>issue</b>.</i>
<b>lineage</b>	The number of lines in a piece of printed material. <i>His entire <b>lineage</b> has been warriors.</i>

<b>offspring</b>	The product or result of something. <i>Industrialism prepared the way for acceptance of the French Revolution's various socialistic <b>offspring</b>.</i>
<b>scions</b>	A descendent or heir. <i>A scion of royal stock.</i>
<b><u>stock</u></b>	A portion of a company's stock as held by an individual or group as an investment. <i>They will cut round <b>stock</b> to 1 inch diameter.</i>
<b>successors</b>	A person who inherits some title or office. <i>He was President Lincoln's successor.</i>
<b>young</b>	Young people collectively. <i>Many grebes carry their <b>young</b> on their backs.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Progeny" as a noun

- *Shorthorn cattle are highly effective in bestowing their characteristics on their progeny.*



## Associations of "Progeny" (30 Words)

<b>beget</b>	Make (offspring) by reproduction. <i>They hoped that the King might <b>beget</b> an heir by his new queen.</i>
<b><u>caregiver</u></b>	A person who is responsible for attending to the needs of a child or dependent adult.
<b>dad</b>	An informal term for a father; probably derived from baby talk. <i>His <b>dad</b> was with him.</i>
<b>daddy</b>	The best or most successful person. <i>It s you who s calling the shots now you re the <b>daddy</b>.</i>
<b><u>daughter</u></b>	A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source. <i>A <b>daughter</b> of the dry savannas of Africa.</i>
<b>descendants</b>	All of the offspring of a given progenitor.
<b>family</b>	A local organizational unit of the Mafia or other large criminal group. <i>The <b>family</b> lived in a large house with a lot of land.</i>

<b>father</b>	A male parent also used as a term of address to your father. <i>A collection of Irish stories was <b>fathered</b> on him.</i>
<b>grandchild</b>	A child of one's son or daughter.
<b>grandma</b>	The mother of your father or mother. <i><b>Grandma</b> didn't stop talking.</i>
<b>grandpa</b>	One's grandfather.
<b>grandparent</b>	A parent of one's father or mother; a grandmother or grandfather. <i>It must be a great blessing to have Chloe's <b>grandparents</b> living nearby.</i>
<b>lineal</b>	Arranged in a line. <i>A <b>lineal</b> descendant.</i>
<b>mom</b>	Informal terms for a mother. <i>My <b>mom</b> gave us each a slice of pizza.</i>
<b>mommy</b>	Informal terms for a mother.
<b><u>mother</u></b>	A term of address for a mother superior. <i>Necessity is the <b>mother</b> of invention.</i>
<b>mummy</b>	Informal terms for a mother. <i>The <b>mummy</b> of Tutankhamen.</i>
<b>offspring</b>	Something that comes into existence as a result. <i>She was the mother of many <b>offspring</b>.</i>
<b><u>parent</u></b>	Be or act as a parent to a child. <i>Some of the whetstones have been transported up to 400 km from the <b>parent</b> rock.</i>
<b>parental</b>	Denoting an organization or company which owns or controls a number of subsidiaries. <i><b>Parental</b> leave.</i>
<b>paternal</b>	Related on the father's side. <i>He reasserted his <b>paternal</b> authority.</i>
<b>paternity</b>	The state of being a father. <i>Tests were conducted to determine <b>paternity</b>.</i>
<b>patriarchy</b>	A system of society or government in which men hold the power and women are largely excluded from it. <i>The dominant ideology of <b>patriarchy</b>.</i>
<b>procreate</b>	(of people or animals) produce young; reproduce. <i>The Bible tells people to <b>procreate</b>.</i>
<b>scion</b>	A descendent or heir. <i>He was the <b>scion</b> of a wealthy family.</i>
<b><u>sibling</u></b>	A person's brother or sister.



**sister**

A black woman (chiefly used as a term of address by other black people).  
*The **sisters** announced that there would be a special rosary every morning.*

**sisterhood**

The kinship relation between a female offspring and the siblings.  
*Canadian feminists acknowledge their **sisterhood** with women around the globe.*

**son**

In Christian belief the second person of the Trinity Christ.  
*The **sons** of Adam.*

**surname**

Give a surname to.  
*He changed his **surname** from Kaye to Kasmin.*
