broadcast	Broadcast over the airwaves as in radio or television. <i>The second method is to broadcast the seeds together with not more than 1 kg to the acre of rapeseed.</i>
<u>convent</u>	A school attached to and run by a convent. <i>Maria entered the convent at the age of eighteen.</i>
curriculum	An integrated course of academic studies. <i>Course components of the school curriculum.</i>
database	A structured set of data held in a computer, especially one that is accessible in various ways. <i>A database covering nine million workers.</i>
demonstrative	A demonstrative determiner or pronoun. <i>An affectionate and demonstrative family.</i>
didactic	Intended to teach, particularly in having moral instruction as an ulterior motive. <i>A didactic novel that set out to expose social injustice.</i>
educational	Relating to the process of education. <i>Seeing an analyst was a very educational experience.</i>
ergonomics	The branch of engineering science in which biological science is used to study the relation between workers and their environments.
expository	Serving to expound or set forth. <i>Clean expository writing.</i>
extracurricular	Outside the normal routine, especially that provided by a job or marriage. <i>Sports and drama are popular extracurricular activities.</i>
hortative	Giving strong encouragement.
hospice	A program of medical and emotional care for the terminally ill. <i>Hospice workers.</i>

indoor	Relating to sports played indoors. <i>The national indoor champion.</i>
<u>induction</u>	The action or process of inducting someone to a post or organization. <i>The induction of malformations by radiation.</i>
informative	Providing or conveying information. <i>A thought provoking informative article.</i>
instructive	Useful and informative. <i>It is instructive to compare the two projects.</i>
<u>internal</u>	Of the inner nature of a thing; intrinsic. <i>The nation s internal politics.</i>
interpretive	That provides interpretation.
intramural	Situated or done within the walls of a building. <i>Most of the students participated actively in the college s intramural sports program.</i>
kindergarten	A preschool for children age 4 to 6 to prepare them for primary school.
moralize	Comment on issues of right and wrong, typically with an unfounded air of superiority. <i>The solution to climate change is not to moralize from on high.</i>
mural	Relating to or occurring in the wall of a body cavity or blood vessel. <i>Mural thrombosis.</i>
orphanage	The condition of being a child without living parents. <i>His early orphanage shaped his character as an adult.</i>
reformatory	Tending or intended to produce reform. <i>Reformatory punishment.</i>
rehabilitation	The action of restoring someone to health or normal life through training and therapy after imprisonment, addiction, or illness. <i>The rehabilitation of the mangrove forests.</i>
renewal	The replacement or repair of something. <i>The contracts came up for renewal.</i>
spreadsheet	A computer program used to create and manipulate spreadsheets. <i>We have a colour coded Excel spreadsheet of all of our trip expenses.</i>
syllabus	The subjects in a course of study or teaching. <i>The history syllabus.</i>
viewer	A person who looks at or inspects something. <i>Our presenters are role models for young viewers.</i>
