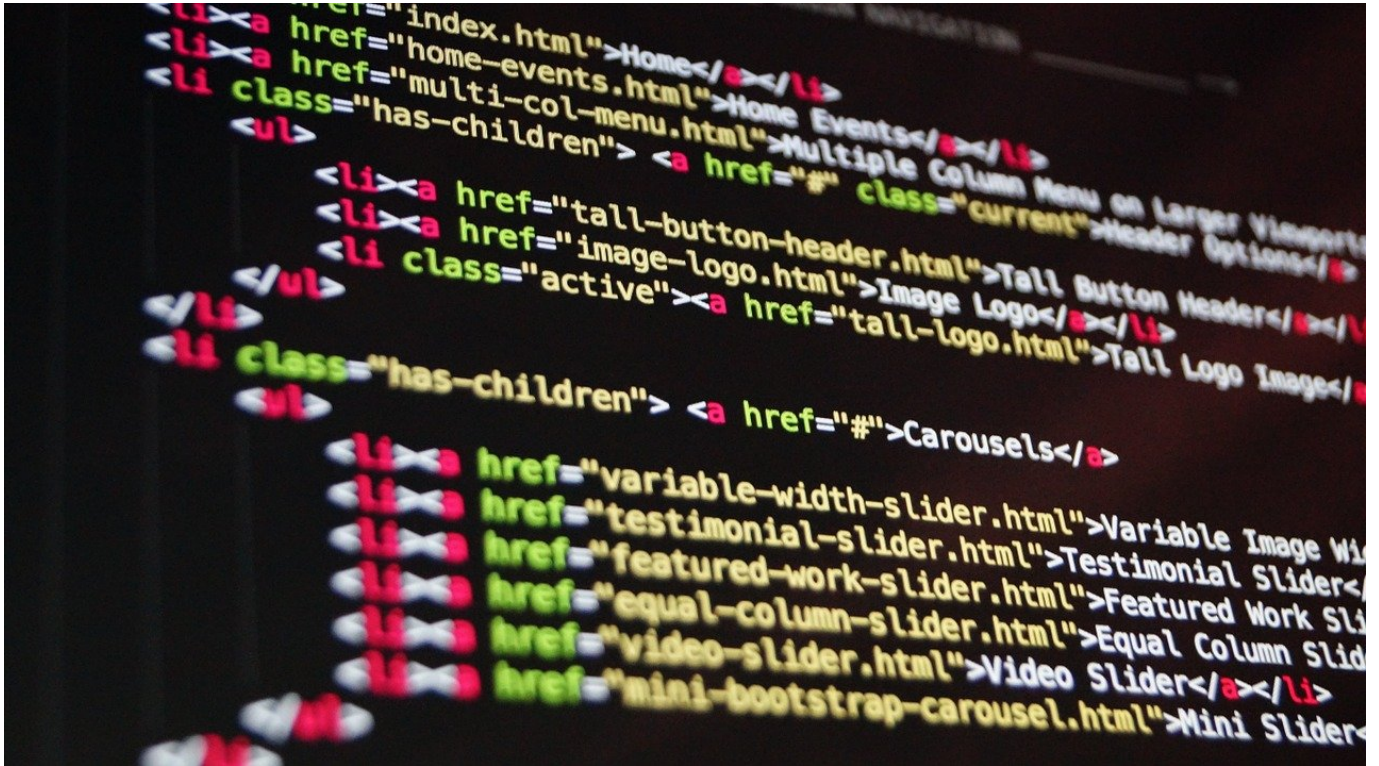

applied	(of a subject of study) put to practical use as opposed to being theoretical. <i>Applied physics.</i>
computer	An expert at calculation (or at operating calculating machines. The notional environment in which communication over computer networks
cyberspace	occurs. <i>I stayed in cyberspace for just a few minutes.</i>
database	An organized body of related information. <i>Database systems.</i>
desktop	The working area of a computer screen regarded as a representation of a notional desktop and containing icons representing items such as files. <i>You can now have multiple overlapping windows on the desktop.</i>
download	An act or process of downloading data. <i>We have music available for free download.</i>

functional	In operation; working. <i>There are important functional differences between left and right brain.</i>
hardware	Tools, implements, and other items used in home life and activities such as gardening. <i>Available from DIY stores and hardware shops.</i>
headed	Having a heading or course in a certain direction. <i>A cool headed fighter pilot.</i>
illiteracy	Ignorance resulting from not reading. <i>His economic illiteracy.</i>
internet	A global computer network providing a variety of information and communication facilities, consisting of interconnected networks using standardized communication protocols. <i>An internet connection.</i>
license	Permit (someone) to do something. <i>He was licensed to do no more than send a message.</i>
morph	An instance of morphing an image. <i>The computer programmer morphed the image.</i>
net	A communications or broadcasting network especially of maritime radio. <i>He spread his net far and wide in his long search for success.</i>
online	By means of the internet or other computer network. <i>Shoppers would rather pick up the phone than do business online.</i>
operational	Relating to or in accordance with operationalism. <i>The coffee bar s initial operational costs.</i>
oriented	Adjusted or located in relation to surroundings or circumstances; sometimes used in combination. <i>The house had its large windows oriented toward the ocean view.</i>
portable	A small transportable building used as a classroom. <i>A portable television.</i>
positivistic	Of or relating to positivism.
practical	Guided by practical experience and observation rather than theory. <i>He is a very practical person.</i>
pragmatic	Relating to pragmatics. <i>Not ideology but pragmatic politics.</i>
server	A person assisting the celebrant at the celebration of the Eucharist. <i>The software runs on a variety of Unix servers.</i>
serviceable	Intended or able to serve a purpose without elaboration. <i>A serviceable kitchen gadget.</i>

software	(computer science) written programs or procedures or rules and associated documentation pertaining to the operation of a computer system and that are stored in read/write memory. <i>The software industry.</i>
spreadsheet	A computer program used to create and manipulate spreadsheets. <i>We have a colour coded Excel spreadsheet of all of our trip expenses.</i>
<u>technical</u>	Involving or concerned with applied and industrial sciences. <i>A technical report.</i>
<u>theoretical</u>	Concerned primarily with theories or hypotheses rather than practical considerations. <i>The theoretical value of their work.</i>
utilitarian	Relating to or adhering to the doctrine of utilitarianism. <i>A utilitarian theorist.</i>
<u>virtual</u>	Relating to the points at which rays would meet if produced backwards. <i>Virtual learning.</i>
website	A set of related web pages located under a single domain name, typically produced by a single person or organization. <i>For more information please visit our website.</i>
