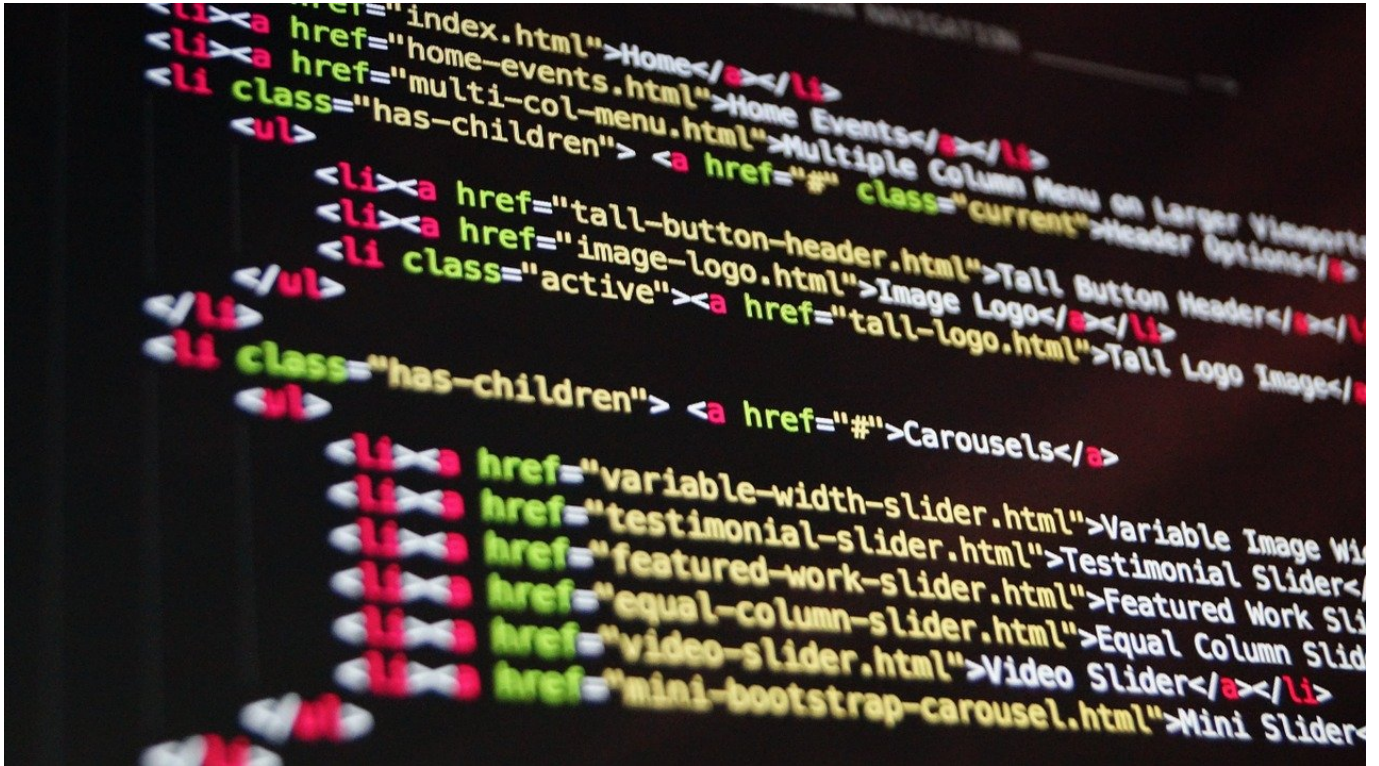

- computer** An expert at calculation (or at operating calculating machines.  
The notional environment in which communication over computer networks
- cyberspace** occurs.  
*I stayed in **cyberspace** for just a few minutes.*
- database** An organized body of related information.  
***Database** systems.*
- desktop** The working area of a computer screen regarded as a representation of a notional desktop and containing icons representing items such as files.  
*You can now have multiple overlapping windows on the **desktop**.*
- download** An act or process of downloading data.  
*We have music available for free **download**.*

<b>functional</b>	In operation; working. <i>There are important <b>functional</b> differences between left and right brain.</i>
<b>hardware</b>	Tools, implements, and other items used in home life and activities such as gardening. <i>Available from DIY stores and <b>hardware</b> shops.</i>
<b>headed</b>	Having a heading or course in a certain direction. <i>A cool <b>headed</b> fighter pilot.</i>
<b>illiteracy</b>	Ignorance resulting from not reading. <i>His economic <b>illiteracy</b>.</i>
<b>internet</b>	A global computer network providing a variety of information and communication facilities, consisting of interconnected networks using standardized communication protocols. <i>An <b>internet</b> connection.</i>
<b>license</b>	Permit (someone) to do something. <i>He was <b>licensed</b> to do no more than send a message.</i>
<b>morph</b>	An instance of morphing an image. <i>The computer programmer <b>morphed</b> the image.</i>
<b>net</b>	A communications or broadcasting network especially of maritime radio. <i>He spread his <b>net</b> far and wide in his long search for success.</i>
<b>online</b>	By means of the internet or other computer network. <i>Shoppers would rather pick up the phone than do business <b>online</b>.</i>
<b>operational</b>	Relating to or in accordance with operationalism. <i>The coffee bar s initial <b>operational</b> costs.</i>
<b>oriented</b>	Adjusted or located in relation to surroundings or circumstances; sometimes used in combination. <i>The house had its large windows <b>oriented</b> toward the ocean view.</i>
<b>portable</b>	A small transportable building used as a classroom. <i>A <b>portable</b> television.</i>
<b>positivistic</b>	Of or relating to positivism.
<b>practical</b>	Guided by practical experience and observation rather than theory. <i>He is a very <b>practical</b> person.</i>
<b>pragmatic</b>	Relating to pragmatics. <i>Not ideology but <b>pragmatic</b> politics.</i>
<b>server</b>	A person assisting the celebrant at the celebration of the Eucharist. <i>The software runs on a variety of Unix <b>servers</b>.</i>
<b>serviceable</b>	Intended or able to serve a purpose without elaboration. <i>A <b>serviceable</b> kitchen gadget.</i>

<b>software</b>	(computer science) written programs or procedures or rules and associated documentation pertaining to the operation of a computer system and that are stored in read/write memory. <i>The <b>software</b> industry.</i>
<b>spreadsheet</b>	A computer program used to create and manipulate spreadsheets. <i>We have a colour coded Excel <b>spreadsheet</b> of all of our trip expenses.</i>
<b><u>technical</u></b>	Involving or concerned with applied and industrial sciences. <i>A <b>technical</b> report.</i>
<b><u>theoretical</u></b>	Concerned primarily with theories or hypotheses rather than practical considerations. <i>The <b>theoretical</b> value of their work.</i>
<b>utilitarian</b>	Relating to or adhering to the doctrine of utilitarianism. <i>A <b>utilitarian</b> theorist.</i>
<b><u>virtual</u></b>	Relating to the points at which rays would meet if produced backwards. <i><b>Virtual</b> learning.</i>
<b>website</b>	A set of related web pages located under a single domain name, typically produced by a single person or organization. <i>For more information please visit our <b>website</b>.</i>
