| amelioration | The act of making something better; improvement. <i>Progress brings with it the amelioration of the human condition.</i> |
| betterment | The enhanced value of real property arising from local improvements. <i>They believed that what they were doing was vital for the betterment of society.</i> |
| breakthrough | A productive insight. <i>His big breakthrough came in 1988 when he had two paintings accepted by the RSA.</i> |
| clinch | Fasten a rope or angling line with a clinch knot. <i>Clinch a deal.</i> |
| continue | Continue a certain state condition or activity. <i>The bad weather continued for two more weeks.</i> |
| continued | Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>He asked for their continued support.</i> |
| demotion | Act of lowering in rank or position. <i>Too many demotions would weaken morale.</i> |
| develop | Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. <i>The piano develops the melody into a short cadenza.</i> |
| evolve | Give off (gas or heat). <i>Modern man evolved a long time ago.</i> |
| expedite | Process fast and efficiently. <i>This should expedite the process.</i> |

| forwarding | Involving sending a letter or email on to a further destination. <i>The forwarding of resumes to the personnel department.</i> |
| furtherance | The advancement of some enterprise. <i>The court held that the union's acts were not in furtherance of a trade dispute.</i> |
| improve | To make better. <i>The editor improved the manuscript with his changes.</i> |
| improvement | A change for the better; progress in development. <i>It's an improvement on the last cake I made.</i> |
| ongoing | Continuing; still in progress. <i>Ongoing negotiations.</i> |
| persist | Be persistent refuse to stop. <i>If the symptoms persist for more than a few days then contact your doctor.</i> |
| preferment | The act of preferring. <i>Most of her ministers owed their first preferment to her.</i> |
| procedure | A particular course of action intended to achieve a result. <i>Parliamentary procedure.</i> |
| proceed | Start a lawsuit against someone. <i>We proceeded towards Washington.</i> |
| process | Subject to a process or treatment with the aim of readying for some purpose improving or remedying a condition. <i>Process cheese.</i> |
| progression | A series with a definite pattern of advance. <i>A blues progression.</i> |
| progressively | Steadily; in stages. <i>A circle of progressively minded reformers.</i> |
| promotion | A message issued in behalf of some product or cause or idea or person or institution. <i>United won promotion last season.</i> |
| sere | (used especially of vegetation) having lost all moisture. <i>The desert was edged with sere vegetation.</i> |
| stage | Diagnose or classify a disease or patient as having reached a particular stage in the expected progression of the disease. <i>An early movie simply showed a long kiss by two actors of the contemporary stage.</i> |
| step | The distance covered by a step. <i>He taught them the waltz step.</i> |
