<b>clinch</b>	Fasten a rope or angling line with a clinch knot. <i><b>Clinch</b> a deal.</i>
<b>continue</b>	Continue a certain state condition or activity. <i>The bad weather <b>continued</b> for two more weeks.</i>
<b>continued</b>	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>He asked for their <b>continued</b> support.</i>
<b>demotion</b>	Act of lowering in rank or position. <i>Too many <b>demotions</b> would weaken morale.</i>
<b>develop</b>	Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. <i>The piano <b>develops</b> the melody into a short cadenza.</i>
<b>evolve</b>	Give off (gas or heat). <i>Modern man <b>evolved</b> a long time ago.</i>
<b>expedite</b>	Process fast and efficiently. <i>This should <b>expedite</b> the process.</i>

<b>forwarding</b>	Involving sending a letter or email on to a further destination. <i>The <b>forwarding</b> of resumes to the personnel department.</i>
<b>furtherance</b>	The advancement of some enterprise. <i>The court held that the union s acts were not in <b>furtherance</b> of a trade dispute.</i>
<b>improve</b>	To make better. <i>The editor <b>improved</b> the manuscript with his changes.</i>
<b>improvement</b>	A change for the better; progress in development. <i>It s an <b>improvement</b> on the last cake I made.</i>
<b>ongoing</b>	Continuing; still in progress. <i><b>Ongoing</b> negotiations.</i>
<b>persist</b>	Be persistent refuse to stop. <i>If the symptoms <b>persist</b> for more than a few days then contact your doctor.</i>
<b>preferment</b>	The act of preferring. <i>Most of her ministers owed their first <b>preferment</b> to her.</i>
<b>procedure</b>	A particular course of action intended to achieve a result. <i>Parliamentary <b>procedure</b>.</i>
<b>proceed</b>	Start a lawsuit against someone. <i>We <b>proceeded</b> towards Washington.</i>
<b>process</b>	Subject to a process or treatment with the aim of readying for some purpose improving or remedying a condition. <i><b>Process</b> cheese.</i>
<b>progression</b>	A series with a definite pattern of advance. <i>A blues <b>progression</b>.</i>
<b>progressively</b>	Steadily; in stages. <i>A circle of <b>progressively</b> minded reformers.</i>
<b>promotion</b>	A message issued in behalf of some product or cause or idea or person or institution. <i>United won <b>promotion</b> last season.</i>
<b>sere</b>	(used especially of vegetation) having lost all moisture. <i>The desert was edged with <b>sere</b> vegetation.</i>
<b>stage</b>	Diagnose or classify a disease or patient as having reached a particular stage in the expected progression of the disease. <i>An early movie simply showed a long kiss by two actors of the contemporary <b>stage</b>.</i>
<b>step</b>	The distance covered by a step. <i>He taught them the waltz <b>step</b>.</i>
