### Definitions of "Proletariat" as a noun

- *A social class comprising those who do manual labor or work for wages.*
- *The lowest class of citizens in ancient Rome.*

<b>labor</b>	A social class comprising those who do manual labor or work for wages. <i>His <b>labor</b> did not require a great deal of skill.</i>
<b>labour</b>	A group of moles. <i>Manual <b>labour</b>.</i>
<b>the common people</b>	A piece of open land for recreational use in an urban area.
<b>the labouring classes</b>	People having the same social, economic, or educational status.
<b>the lower classes</b>	The lower of two berths.
<b>the masses</b>	The property of something that is great in magnitude.

<b>the ordinary people</b>	A judge of a probate court.
<b>the rank and file</b>	A row or line of people (especially soldiers or police) standing abreast of one another.
<b>the third estate</b>	Following the second position in an ordering or series.
<b>the workers</b>	A person who acts and gets things done.
<b>working class</b>	A mine or quarry that is being or has been worked.
<b>working-class people</b>	The body of citizens of a state or country.

<a href="#"><u>anarchist</u></a>	A person who advocates or promotes anarchism or anarchy. <i>An <b>anarchist</b> newspaper.</i>
<a href="#"><u>bourgeois</u></a>	A bourgeois person. <i><b>Bourgeois</b> society took for granted the sanctity of property.</i>
<a href="#"><u>businessman</u></a>	A man who works in commerce, especially at executive level.
<a href="#"><u>capitalism</u></a>	An economic system based on private ownership of capital. <i>Private ownership is a key feature of <b>capitalism</b>.</i>
<b>capitalist</b>	Of or relating to capitalism or capitalists. <i><b>Capitalist</b> countries.</i>
<a href="#"><u>collective</u></a>	A collective farm. <i>The <b>collective</b> power of the workforce.</i>
<a href="#"><u>communism</u></a>	A political theory favoring collectivism in a classless society.
<a href="#"><u>communist</u></a>	A member of the communist party. <i><b>Communist</b> governments.</i>
<a href="#"><u>conservative</u></a>	Unimaginatively conventional. <i>The Massachusetts liberal who <b>conservatives</b> love to hate.</i>
<a href="#"><u>coup</u></a>	A sudden and decisive change of government illegally or by force. <i>It was a major <b>coup</b> to get such a prestigious contract.</i>
<b>demagogue</b>	A political leader who seeks support by appealing to popular passions and prejudices. <i>The Athenian <b>demagogues</b> had definite and valuable functions within the state.</i>

<b>democracy</b>	A state governed under a system of democracy. <i>A multiparty <b>democracy</b>.</i>
<b>democratic</b>	Representing or appealing to or adapted for the benefit of the people at large. <i><b>Democratic</b> countries.</i>
<b>entrepreneur</b>	A person who sets up a business or businesses, taking on financial risks in the hope of profit. <i>Many <b>entrepreneurs</b> see potential in this market.</i>
<b>fascism</b>	A political theory advocating an authoritarian hierarchical government (as opposed to democracy or liberalism). <i>This is yet another example of health <b>fascism</b> in action.</i>
<b>insurgent</b>	Rising in active revolt. <i>An attack by armed <b>insurgents</b>.</i>
<b>junta</b>	A military or political group that rules a country after taking power by force. <i>The country's ruling military <b>junta</b>.</i>
<b>labor</b>	A social class comprising those who do manual labor or work for wages. <i>She was in <b>labor</b> for six hours.</i>
<b>libertarian</b>	An advocate of libertarianism. <i>He holds <b>libertarian</b> views on most social issues.</i>
<b>materialistic</b>	Conforming to the standards and conventions of the middle class. <i>We're living in a highly <b>materialistic</b> society.</i>
<b>nihilist</b>	A person who believes that life is meaningless and rejects all religious and moral principles. <i>It is impossible to argue against a <b>nihilist</b>.</i>
<b>political</b>	Relating to the government or public affairs of a country. <i>I'm not very <b>political</b>.</i>
<u><b>politician</b></u>	A leader engaged in civil administration. <i>A veteran communist <b>politician</b>.</i>
<b>proletarian</b>	A member of the working class (not necessarily employed). <i>They are true <b>proletarians</b>.</i>
<u><b>radical</b></u>	Markedly new or introducing radical change. <i><b>Radical</b> leaves.</i>
<u><b>revolutionary</b></u>	Advocating or engaged in revolution. <i>A <b>revolutionary</b> discovery.</i>
<b>socialist</b>	Advocating or following the socialist principles. <i>The history of <b>socialist</b> movement.</i>

subversive

A subversive person.

***Subversive*** literature.

**totalitarianism**

A form of government in which the ruler is an absolute dictator (not restricted by a constitution or laws or opposition etc.

*Democratic countries were fighting against **totalitarianism**.*

utopia

A work of fiction describing a utopia.

*Misplaced faith in political **utopias** has led to ruin.*
