luxuriant	Produced or growing in extreme abundance. <i>She tossed her luxuriant dark hair.</i>
munificent	Characterized by or displaying great generosity. <i>His father gave him a half dollar and his mother a quarter and he thought them munificent.</i>
plentiful	Existing in great number or quantity. <i>Food is plentiful.</i>
productive	Producing or able to produce large amounts of goods, crops, or other commodities. <i>Many suffixes are common and productive.</i>
<u>profuse</u>	(of a person) extravagant. <i>They are profuse in hospitality.</i>
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>A rich tenor voice.</i>
superabundant	Most excessively abundant.

fecundity	The intellectual productivity of a creative imagination. <i>Age related decline in female fecundity.</i>
fertile	(of soil or land) producing or capable of producing abundant vegetation or crops. <i>The fertile coastal plain.</i>

fertility	The property of producing abundantly and sustaining vigorous and luxuriant growth. <i>Improve the soil fertility by adding compost.</i>
fructify	Make productive or fruitful. <i>They were sacrificed in order that their blood might fructify the crops.</i>
fruitful	Producing good or helpful results; productive. <i>Be fruitful and multiply.</i>
harvest	Gather a crop as a harvest. <i>The quantity of squid harvested has risen.</i>
hinterland	The area around or beyond a major town or port. <i>A market town serving its rich agricultural hinterland.</i>
