### careless

Marked by lack of attention or consideration or forethought or thoroughness; not careful.

*Forgotten by some **careless** person.*

### casual

Appropriate for ordinary or routine occasions.

***Casual** clothes.*

### **debauched**

Unrestrained by convention or morality.

*Congreve draws a **debauched** aristocratic society.*

### **dissipated**

Unrestrained by convention or morality.

*Led a **dissipated** life.*

### **dissolute**

Unrestrained by convention or morality.

*Unfortunately his heir was feckless and **dissolute**.*

### **easy**

In fortunate circumstances financially; moderately rich.

*An **easy** victim.*

<b><u>haphazard</u></b>	Marked by great carelessness. <i>A <b>haphazard</b> plan of action.</i>
<b>indiscriminate</b>	(of a person) not using or exercising discrimination. <i>An <b>indiscriminate</b> mixture of colors and styles.</i>
<b><u>irresponsible</u></b>	Showing lack of care for consequences. <i>Behaved like an <b>irresponsible</b> idiot.</i>
<b><u>licentious</u></b>	Lacking moral discipline; especially sexually unrestrained. <i>Coarse and <b>licentious</b> men.</i>
<b>light</b>	Characterized by or emitting light. <i>Walked with a <b>light</b> tripping step.</i>
<b><u>loose</u></b>	Not held or tied together or contained within something. <i>The large shoes were very <b>loose</b>.</i>
<b>random</b>	Governed by or involving equal chances for each item. <i><b>Random</b> movements.</i>
<b>sexually indiscriminate</b>	Not marked by fine distinctions.
<b><u>thoughtless</u></b>	Without care or thought for others. <i>To think a few minutes of <b>thoughtless</b> pleasure could end in this.</i>
<b>unconsidered</b>	Without proper consideration or reflection. <i>Prejudice is the holding of <b>unconsidered</b> opinions.</i>
<b>undiscriminating</b>	Not having or showing good judgement or taste. <i>Junk food is suited only to the <b>undiscriminating</b> palates of the young.</i>
<b>unselective</b>	Not selective or discriminating. <i>A devout and <b>unselective</b> fan.</i>
<b>unthinking</b>	Mentally sluggish. <i>She was at pains to correct <b>unthinking</b> prejudices.</i>
<b><u>wanton</u></b>	Occurring without motivation or provocation- F.D.Roosevelt. <i>Her cheeks burned as she recalled how forward she had been how <b>wanton</b>.</i>
<b>wild</b>	Produced from wild animals or plants without cultivation. <i>A <b>wild</b> stretch of land.</i>

- *Americans are free to choose from a promiscuous array of values.*

**chaotic**

Relating to systems which exhibit chaos.

*The political situation was **chaotic**.*

<b>complex</b>	Make an atom or compound form a complex with another. <i>Cross linked protein DNA <b>complexes</b>.</i>
<b><u>complicated</u></b>	Consisting of many interconnecting parts or elements; intricate. <b><i>Complicated</i></b> Middle East politics.
<b>confusing</b>	Bewildering or perplexing. <i>He found being in Egypt very <b>confusing</b>.</i>
<b>convolution</b>	The action of coiling or twisting or winding together. <i>The <b>convolutions</b> of farm policy.</i>
<b><u>discombobulated</u></b>	Confused and disconcerted. <i>He is looking a little pained and <b>discombobulated</b>.</i>
<b>disordered</b>	Thrown into a state of disarray or confusion. <i>A patient who is mentally <b>disordered</b>.</i>
<b>disorderly</b>	Undisciplined and unruly. <b><i>Disorderly</i></b> youths.
<b><u>disorganized</u></b>	Not properly planned and controlled. <i>A thousand pages of muddy and <b>disorganized</b> prose.</i>
<b><u>haphazard</u></b>	Without care; in a slapdash manner. <i>A most <b>haphazard</b> system of record keeping.</i>
<b>indiscriminate</b>	Done at random or without careful judgement. <i>An <b>indiscriminate</b> mixture of colors and styles.</i>
<b>intricate</b>	Having many complexly arranged elements; elaborate. <b><i>Intricate</i></b> lacework.
<b>jumble</b>	Articles collected for a jumble sale. <i>We are collecting <b>jumble</b> for charity.</i>
<b><u>labyrinth</u></b>	A complex structure in the inner ear which contains the organs of hearing and balance It consists of bony cavities the bony labyrinth filled with fluid and lined with sensitive membranes the membranous labyrinth. <i>A <b>labyrinth</b> of conflicting laws and regulations.</i>
<b><u>labyrinthine</u></b>	Relating to or affecting or originating in the inner ear. <i>A <b>labyrinthine</b> network of tortuous footpaths.</i>
<b><u>loose</u></b>	Become loose or looser or less tight. <i>A <b>loose</b> ball.</i>
<b><u>maze</u></b>	A complex network of paths or passages. <i>The house has a <b>maze</b> and a walled Italian garden.</i>
<b>melee</b>	A noisy riotous fight. <i>Several people were hurt in the <b>melee</b>.</i>

<b><u>messy</u></b>	Untidy or dirty. <i>Stripping wallpaper can be a <b>messy</b> time consuming job.</i>
<b><u>mingle</u></b>	Get involved or mixed-up with. <i>The sound of voices <b>mingled</b> with a scraping of chairs.</i>
<b>perplexing</b>	Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity. <i><b>Perplexing</b> to someone who knew nothing about it.</i>
<b>perplexity</b>	Trouble or confusion resulting from complexity. <i>The dense <b>perplexity</b> of dwarf palm garlanded creepers glossy undergrowth.</i>
<b>random</b>	Governed by or involving equal chances for each item. <i>A <b>random</b> sample of 100 households.</i>
<b>ravel</b>	Untangle or unravel something. <i>A <b>ravelled</b> story.</i>
<b>slapdash</b>	Done too hurriedly and carelessly. <i>The shelves were put up <b>slapdash</b>.</i>
<b>slipshod</b>	Characterized by a lack of care, thought, or organization. <i>He d caused many problems with his <b>slipshod</b> management.</i>
<b><u>sloppy</u></b>	(of literature or behaviour) weakly or foolishly sentimental. <i>Lovers of <b>sloppy</b> romance.</i>
<b><u>unfaithful</u></b>	Disloyal, treacherous, or insincere. <i>An <b>unfaithful</b> lover.</i>
<b>untidy</b>	Not inclined to keep one's possessions or appearance neat and in order. <i>She was chronically <b>untidy</b> and her clothes lay where she had dropped them.</i>
