- With little or no delay.
- At exactly a specified time; punctually.
- With little or no delay; immediately.

rapidly With rapid movements.

The business is expanding **rapidly**.

readily Without much difficulty.

He **readily** admits that the new car surpasses its predecessors.

**right away** Precisely, exactly.

speedily With speed.

Your claim will be dealt with as **speedily** as possible.

Without delay; after a very short time.

**swiftly** This comment was **swiftly** followed by an apology for such a poor

choice of words.

**instantaneous** Existing or measured at a particular instant.

Modern methods of **instantaneous** communication.

instantaneously Without any delay.

Soldiers must be ready to react **instantaneously**.

instantly At once; immediately.

**now** Used when pausing or considering one's next words.
