Definitions of "Properly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “properly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In accordance with what is appropriate or suitable for the circumstances.*
- *Appropriately for the circumstances; suitably or respectably.*
- *In the right manner.*
- *In the right manner; correctly; suitably.*
- *With reason or justice.*
- *Thoroughly; completely.*
- *Indicating exactness or preciseness.*
- *In the strict sense; exactly.*
- *Correctly or satisfactorily.*



Synonyms of "Properly" as an adverb (18 Words)

all right	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’).
appropriately	In an appropriate manner. <i>He was appropriately dressed.</i>
befittingly	In accordance with what is appropriate or suitable for the circumstances.
consistently	In every case or on every occasion; invariably. <i>The vehicle consistently outperforms some of the best competitors.</i>
correctly	In a way that is socially acceptable; properly. <i>The flower had been correctly depicted by his son.</i>
correspondingly	In an analogous or equivalent way. <i>It has fewer problems and correspondingly requires less maintenance.</i>
decent	In the right manner; correctly; suitably. <i>Can t you carry me decent.</i>
decently	To an acceptable or comfortable standard; satisfactorily. <i>They would like to be decently paid for the work they do.</i>
duly	In accordance with what is appropriate or suitable for the circumstances. <i>A document duly signed and authorized by the inspector.</i>
exactly	Indicating exactness or preciseness. <i>What exactly are you looking for.</i>
fitly	In an appropriate manner.

fittingly	In a way that is suitable or appropriate under the circumstances. <i>Perhaps fittingly Scotland has its share of outdoor clothing firms.</i>
in every respect	To or toward the inside of.
just	Simply; only; no more than. <i>That s just what I need.</i>
precisely	Exactly (used to emphasize the complete accuracy or truth of a statement). <i>Kids will love it precisely because it will irritate their parents.</i>
right	In the right manner correctly suitably. <i>Nothing s going right for me this season.</i>
rightly	In accordance with justice or what is morally right. <i>The delicious cuisine for which her country was rightly famous.</i>
suitably	In an appropriate manner. <i>Dress suitably for the hot weather.</i>

- *Ensuring the work is carried out properly.*
- *Algebra is, properly speaking, the analysis of equations.*
- *A properly drafted agreement.*
- *Please do your job properly!*
- *If you don't behave properly, you'll have to leave!*
- *On the first day she felt properly well, Millie sat out on the front steps.*

acknowledgement	The state or quality of being recognized or acknowledged. <i>She seems to avoid much in the way of recognition or acknowledgement of feminist work prior to her own.</i>
applicable	Relevant or appropriate. <i>The same considerations are equally applicable to accident claims.</i>
<u>apposite</u>	Apt in the circumstances or in relation to something. <i>The successful copywriter is a master of apposite and evocative verbal images.</i>
appropriate	Take (something) for one's own use, typically without the owner's permission. <i>It seems that an apology is appropriate.</i>
appropriately	In an appropriate manner. <i>Walls of raw concrete form a neutral yet appropriately rugged backdrop for the various objects.</i>
<u>apropos</u>	Very appropriate to a particular situation. <i>Your letter arrived apropos.</i>
<u>apt</u>	At risk of or subject to experiencing something usually unpleasant. <i>He is apt to lose.</i>
aptly	With competence; in a competent capable manner. <i>America s aptly named Sunshine State.</i>
configure	Set up for a particular purpose. <i>Configure my new computer.</i>
correct	Socially right or correct. <i>Correct behavior.</i>
<u>decent</u>	Decently clothed. <i>There s a few decent players in the team.</i>
duly	In accordance with what is required or appropriate; following proper procedure or arrangement. <i>A document duly signed and authorized by the inspector.</i>
<u>equipped</u>	Provided or fitted out with what is necessary or useful or appropriate. <i>A well equipped playground.</i>
experienced	Having experience; having knowledge or skill from observation or participation. <i>An experienced social worker.</i>
fitting	The action of fitting something. <i>Little remains of the house s Victorian fittings.</i>
germane	Relevant to a subject under consideration. <i>That is not germane to our theme.</i>

<u>install</u>	Put into an office or a position. <i>He was installed as Prime Minister in 1966.</i>
<u>opportune</u>	Suitable or at a time that is suitable or advantageous especially for a particular purpose. <i>An opportune place to make camp.</i>
pertinence	Relevance by virtue of being applicable to the matter at hand.
pertinent	Having precise or logical relevance to the matter at hand. <i>A list of articles pertinent to the discussion.</i>
proper	Belonging or relating exclusively or distinctively to; particular to. <i>The two elephant types proper to Africa and to southern Asia.</i>
<u>propriety</u>	Conformity to conventionally accepted standards of behaviour or morals. <i>He always behaved with the utmost propriety.</i>
<u>relevant</u>	Closely connected or appropriate to what is being done or considered. <i>Critics may find themselves unable to stay relevant in a changing world.</i>
right	Toward or on the right also used figuratively. <i>The allies succeeded in overrunning the French right.</i>
seemly	According with custom or propriety. <i>Seemly behavior.</i>
setup	An act that incriminates someone on a false charge. <i>It takes time to learn the setup around here.</i>
suit	A lawsuit. <i>What suit is trumps.</i>
<u>suitable</u>	Worthy of being chosen especially as a spouse. <i>A tractor suitable or fit for heavy duty.</i>
suitably	In an appropriate manner. <i>The post is open to suitably qualified applicants from all over the world.</i>
<u>timely</u>	Done or happening at the appropriate or proper time. <i>With timely treatment the patient has a good chance of recovery.</i>
