<b>favourable</b>	(of winds or weather) tending to promote or facilitate. A <b>favourable</b> prognosis.
<b>fortunate</b>	Supremely favored. A federal programme aimed at helping less <b>fortunate</b> families.
<b>full of promise</b>	Having ample fabric.
<b>happy</b>	Eagerly disposed to act or to be of service. We will be <b>happy</b> to advise you.
<b>heaven-sent</b>	Peculiarly fortunate or appropriate; as if by divine intervention.
<b>hopeful</b>	Feeling or inspiring optimism about a future event. Found a <b>hopeful</b> way of attacking the problem.
<b>lucky</b>	Occurring by chance. You had a very <b>lucky</b> escape.
<b>optimistic</b>	Hopeful and confident about the future. Took an <b>optimistic</b> view.
<b>promising</b>	Likely to turn out well in the future. A <b>promising</b> start to the season.
<b>providential</b>	Involving divine foresight or providence. His appearance had seemed more than just <b>providential</b> .
<b>rosy</b>	Promising or suggesting good fortune or happiness; hopeful. A <b>rosy</b> cheeked schoolgirl.

- The timing for such a meeting seemed propitious.
- Propitious gales speeded us along.
- There were points on which they did not agree, moments in which she did not seem propitious.

<b>felicitate</b>	Express congratulations. <i>The award winner was <b>felicitated</b> by the cultural association.</i>
<b><u>fortunate</u></b>	Having unexpected good fortune. <i>She d been <b>fortunate</b> to escape serious injury.</i>
<b>gainful</b>	Serving to increase wealth or resources; providing money or other benefit. <i>He soon found <b>gainful</b> employment.</i>
<b>generous</b>	Not petty in character and mind. <i>A <b>generous</b> helping of pasta.</i>
<b><u>genial</u></b>	Diffusing warmth and friendliness. <i>The <b>genial</b> sunshine.</i>
<b>helpful</b>	Providing assistance or serving a useful function. <i>Pages of <b>helpful</b> information.</i>
<b>hopefully</b>	In a hopeful manner. <i>He rode on <b>hopefully</b>.</i>
<b><u>kindly</u></b>	Pleasant and agreeable. <i>Never mind she said <b>kindly</b>.</i>
<b>lucky</b>	Having or bringing good fortune. <i>A <b>lucky</b> man.</i>
<b><u>lucrative</u></b>	Producing a sizeable profit. <i>A <b>lucrative</b> career as a stand up comedian.</i>

<b>optimism</b>	Hopefulness and confidence about the future or the success of something. <i>The talks had been amicable and there were grounds for <b>optimism</b>.</i>
<b>optimistic</b>	Hopeful and confident about the future. <i>The <b>optimistic</b> mood of the Sixties.</i>
<b>philanthropic</b>	Generous in assistance to the poor. <i><b>Philanthropic</b> contributions.</i>
<b>plus</b>	A mathematical operation of addition. <i><b>Plus</b> 60 degrees centigrade.</i>
<b>positive</b>	A positive photographic image especially one printed from a negative. <i>Protons are <b>positive</b>.</i>
<b>profitable</b>	Beneficial; useful. <i>A professionally run and <b>profitable</b> company.</i>
