<b>advantage</b>	Give an advantage to. <i>This system <b>advantages</b> the rich.</i>
<b>backwards</b>	Towards or into a worse state. <i>Penny glanced <b>backwards</b>.</i>
<b><u>behalf</u></b>	For someone's benefit usually expressed as in behalf rather than on behalf and usually with a possessive. <i>In your <b>behalf</b>.</i>
<b>benefit</b>	Derive a benefit from. <i>A <b>benefit</b> gig.</i>
<b>best</b>	The supreme effort one can make. <i>The <b>best</b> time for planting.</i>
<b>better</b>	Get better. <i>His ideas for <b>bettering</b> the lot of the millhands.</i>
<b><u>boon</u></b>	A favour or request. <i>A spanking breeze is a <b>boon</b> to sailors.</i>
<b><u>downside</u></b>	The negative aspect of something otherwise regarded as good or desirable. <i>He says being a rock star is a fun line of work when you're young but admits fame can have its <b>downsides</b>.</i>
<b>excellent</b>	Very good; of the highest quality. <i>Made an <b>excellent</b> speech.</i>
<b>favorite</b>	A special loved one. <i>A <b>favorite</b> tourist attraction.</i>
<b>good</b>	In a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>This stump will make a <b>good</b> picnic table.</i>
<b>indulging</b>	The act of indulging or gratifying a desire.

<b>like</b>	(of a portrait or other image) having a faithful resemblance to the original. <i>A dream<b>like</b> quality.</i>
<b>moll</b>	A gangster's female companion. <i>I'd rush the money over to his <b>moll</b>.</i>
<b>perquisite</b>	A right reserved exclusively by a particular person or group (especially a hereditary or official right). <i>The <b>perquisites</b> of celebrity are intoxicating.</i>
<b>plus</b>	(after a grade) rather better than. <i>A grade of C <b>plus</b>.</i>
<b>positive</b>	A positive photographic image especially one printed from a negative. <i>A player had tested <b>positive</b> for cocaine use.</i>
<b>predilection</b>	A predisposition in favor of something. <i>A <b>predilection</b> for expensive cars.</i>
<b>preeminence</b>	High status importance owing to marked superiority.
<b>prefer</b>	Give preference to one creditor over another. <i>Some people <b>prefer</b> camping to staying in hotels.</i>
<b>prerogative</b>	Arising from the prerogative of the Crown usually delegated to the government or the judiciary and based in common law rather than statutory law. <i>Suffrage was the <b>prerogative</b> of white adult males.</i>
<b>privilege</b>	Grant a privilege or privileges to. <i>I had the <b>privilege</b> of giving the Sir George Brown memorial lecture.</i>
<b>profiteer</b>	A person who profiteers. <i>A war <b>profiteer</b>.</i>
<b>sideways</b>	At an angle. <i>The lorry slid <b>sideways</b> across the road.</i>
<b>superb</b>	Used in names of birds with attractive or colourful plumage e.g superb lyrebird. <i>A <b>superb</b> actor.</i>
<b>tout</b>	Offer racing tips for a share of any resulting winnings. <i>He made his fortune <b>touting</b> tickets.</i>
<b>unmatched</b>	Eminent beyond or above comparison. <i>Infamy <b>unmatched</b> in the Western world.</i>
<b>upside</b>	The more positive aspect of a situation. <i>Being self employed has its <b>upside</b>.</i>
<b>value</b>	Fix or determine the value of assign a value to. <i>She had come to <b>value</b> her privacy.</i>
