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An **anthology** of European poetry.

**antiphon** A musical setting of an antiphon.

Having the same sound (especially the same vowel sound) occurring in

**assonant** successive stressed syllables.

Note the **assonant** words and syllables in tilting at windmills.

**broadcast** Broadcast over the airwaves as in radio or television.

The Queen's annual Christmas TV broadcast.

clipping

The act of clipping or snipping.

He searched through piles of letters and **clipping**s.

**couplet** Two items of the same kind.

cutting Take and Christman and

Take **cutting**s of Christmas cactus and pot them on.

**disperse** Denoting a phase dispersed in another phase as in a colloid.

The crowds **disperse**d.

**doggerel** Comic verse composed in irregular rhythm.

He had heard some silly **doggerel** that kept running through his mind.

**epigram** A short poem, especially a satirical one, with a witty or ingenious ending.

A Wildean **epigram**.

Literature in the form of prose that describes imaginary events and people.

The notion of the country being a democracy is a polite **fiction**.

intersperse Diversify (a thing or things) with other things at intervals.

Deep pools **intersperse**d by shallow shingle banks.

The humanistic study of a body of literature.

literature

A great work of **literature**.

A written message addressed to a person or organization.

Yet another **missive** from the Foreign Office.



**ode** A classical poem of a kind originally meant to be sung.

A composition written in metrical feet forming rhythmical lines.

The sun is an important symbol in this **poem**.

Literature in metrical form.

The genius of **poesy**.

Something regarded as comparable to poetry in its beauty.

**Poetry** and fire are nicely balanced in the music.

**quatrain** A stanza of four lines, especially one having alternate rhymes.

Habitually read a particular newspaper or periodical.

read The thermometer read 0 C.

**rhyme** Of a poem or song be composed in rhyme.

Poetic features such as rhythm **rhyme** and alliteration.

scattered (of electromagnetic radiation or particles) deflected or diffused.

**Scattered** villages.

**sentence** Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law.

Ten army officers were **sentence**d to life imprisonment.

**snippet** A small piece or brief extract.

**Snippet**s of information about the war.

sonnet. Celebrate in a sonnet.

He **sonnet**ed his hostess now.

**stanza** A fixed number of lines of verse forming a unit of a poem.

syllable A character or characters representing a syllable.

The word pocket has two **syllable**s.

Speak in or compose verse versify.

verse Verse drama.

writer A scribe.

The **writer** of the letter.

writing The activity or skill of writing.

The **writing**s of Gertrude Stein.
