Definitions of "Proverbial" as an adjective

- *Well known, especially so as to be stereotypical.*
- *(of a word or phrase) referred to in a proverb or idiom.*
- *Widely known and spoken of.*

Synonyms of "Proverbial" as an adjective (7 Words)

famed	Known about by many people; renowned. <i>He is famed for his eccentricities.</i>
famous	Known about by many people. <i>The country is famous for its natural beauty.</i>
legendary	Described in or based on legends. <i>Her wisdom in matters of childbirth was legendary.</i>
renowned	Known or talked about by many people; famous. <i>Britain is renowned for its love of animals.</i>
time-honoured	Acceptable for a long time.

traditional Pertaining to time-honored orthodox doctrines.
***Traditional** morality.*

well known In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

Usage Examples of "Proverbial" as an adjective

- *I'm going to stick out like the proverbial sore thumb.*
- *Her proverbial lateness.*
- *The Welsh people, whose hospitality is proverbial.*
- *Your proverbial dizzy blonde.*
- *The proverbial absentminded professor.*
