<b>divine intervention</b>	A clergyman or other person in religious orders.
<b>fate</b>	The course of someone's life, or the outcome of a situation for someone or something, seen as outside their control. <i>The guards led her to her <b>fate</b>.</i>
<b>foresight</b>	Seeing ahead; knowing in advance; foreseeing. <i>He had the <b>foresight</b> to check that his escape route was clear.</i>
<b>forethought</b>	Planning or plotting in advance of acting. <i>Jim had the <b>forethought</b> to book in advance.</i>
<b>god's will</b>	A legal document declaring a person's wishes regarding the disposal of their property when they die.
<b>judgement</b>	The mental ability to understand and discriminate between relations. <i>That is not in my <b>judgement</b> the end of the matter.</i>
<b>judiciousness</b>	Good judgment.
<b>kismet</b>	The will of Allah. <i>What chance did I stand against <b>kismet</b>.</i>
<b>nemesis</b>	The inescapable agent of someone's or something's downfall. <i>Will Harry Potter finally defeat his <b>nemesis</b> Voldemort.</i>
<b>precaution</b>	A precautionary measure warding off impending danger or damage or injury etc. <i>He put an ice pack on the injury as a <b>precaution</b>.</i>
<b>predestination</b>	Being determined in advance; especially the doctrine (usually associated with Calvin) that God has foreordained every event throughout eternity (including the final salvation of mankind.
<b>predetermination</b>	(theology) being determined in advance; especially the doctrine (usually associated with Calvin) that God has foreordained every event throughout eternity (including the final salvation of mankind. <i>He entered the argument with a <b>predetermination</b> to prove me wrong.</i>
<b>prudence</b>	Knowing how to avoid embarrassment or distress. <i>We need to exercise <b>prudence</b> in such important matters.</i>
<b>sagacity</b>	The trait of forming opinions by distinguishing and evaluating. <i>A man of great political <b>sagacity</b>.</i>
<b>shrewdness</b>	The quality of having or showing good powers of judgement. <i>He is a man of some tactical <b>shrewdness</b>.</i>

<b>borough</b>	Each of five divisions of New York City.
<b><u>city</u></b>	A town created a city by charter and usually containing a cathedral. <i>Ancient Troy was a great <b>city</b>.</i>
<b><u>constituency</u></b>	An area whose voters elect a representative to a legislative body. <i>A parliamentary candidate in the Hampstead and Highgate <b>constituency</b>.</i>
<b>county</b>	A sporting team playing for a county. <i>Administration at <b>county</b> level.</i>
<b><u>district</u></b>	A division of a county or region that elects its own councillors. <i>An elegant shopping <b>district</b>.</i>
<b><u>divine</u></b>	Resulting from divine providence. <i><b>Divine</b> guidance.</i>

<b>lake</b>	A pool of liquid. <i>The EU wine <b>lake</b>.</i>
<b>limerick</b>	A humorous five-line poem with a rhyme scheme aabba.
<b>local</b>	A local branch of an organization especially a trade union. A <b>local</b> infection.
<b>locality</b>	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>A working class <b>locality</b>.</i>
<b>metropolitan</b>	Relating to or denoting a metropolitan or his see. A <b>metropolitan</b> bishop.
<b>miraculous</b>	Peculiarly fortunate or appropriate; as if by divine intervention. A <b>miraculous</b> cure.
<b>municipal</b>	Relating or belonging to or characteristic of a municipality. <i>International law only authorizes a belligerent to punish a spy under its <b>municipal</b> law.</i>
<b>neighborhood</b>	The approximate amount of something (usually used prepositionally as in ` in the region of. <i>An ethnic <b>neighborhood</b>.</i>
<b>plan</b>	Make a design of plan out in systematic often graphic form. <i>The <b>plans</b> for City Hall were on file.</i>
<b>populous</b>	Having a large population; densely populated. <i>The <b>populous</b> city of Shanghai.</i>
<b>prospective</b>	Likely to happen at a future date. <i>She showed a <b>prospective</b> buyer around the house.</i>
<b>provincial</b>	An inhabitant of a province of a country or empire. <i>The general of the Jesuits receives monthly reports from the <b>provincials</b>.</i>
<b>quarter</b>	Display different coats of arms in quarters of a shield especially to show arms inherited from heiresses who have married into the bearer s family. <i>He dropped a word in the right <b>quarter</b>.</i>
<b>subdivide</b>	Divide into smaller and smaller pieces. <i>This apartment cannot be <b>subdivided</b> any further.</i>
