domain	The content of a particular field of knowledge. <i>The French domains of the Plantagenets.</i>
duty	A government tax on imports or exports. <i>Combat duty in the army.</i>
<u>field</u>	Fields collectively or the manner in which they are spread over the pitch. <i>He longed for the fields of his youth.</i>
<u>forte</u>	Loud. <i>Cooking is his forte.</i>
jurisdiction	The right and power to interpret and apply the law. <i>In some jurisdictions there is a mandatory death sentence for murder.</i>
line	An arrangement of soldiers or ships in a column or line formation a line of battle. <i>That salesman must have practiced his fast line of talk.</i>

line of business	A succession of notes forming a distinctive sequence.
middle america	Time between the beginning and the end of a temporal period.
middle england	An area that is approximately central within some larger region.
non-metropolitan areas	A particular environment or walk of life.
non-metropolitan counties	The largest administrative district within a state.
<u>orbit</u>	One complete circuit round an orbited body. <i>He s out of my orbit.</i>
