- *(in Canada) sporting contests held between teams representing the country's administrative divisions.*
- *An official in charge of an ecclesiastical province acting under the superior general of a religious order.*

- (Roman Catholic Church) an official in charge of an ecclesiastical province acting under the superior general of a religious order.

<u>rustic</u>	A small brownish European moth. <i>They paused to watch the rustics dance and carouse.</i>
village idiot	A settlement smaller than a town.
yahoo	One of a race of brutes resembling men but subject to the Houyhnhnms in a novel by Jonathan Swift.
yokel	An uneducated and unsophisticated person from the countryside.

narrow	Denoting a vowel pronounced with the root of the tongue drawn back so as to narrow the pharynx. <i>They ate a narrow range of foods.</i>
narrow-minded	Rigidly adhering to a particular sect or its doctrines.
outlying	Relatively far from a center or middle. <i>An outlying village.</i>
parochial	Narrowly restricted in outlook or scope. <i>Little sympathy with parochial mentality.</i>
regional	Related or limited to a particular region. <i>Regional variations.</i>
<u>restricted</u>	Restricted in meaning as e g man in a tall man. <i>Some enzymes cleave DNA at restricted sites.</i>
<u>rural</u>	Living in or characteristic of farming or country life. <i>Rural people.</i>
<u>rustic</u>	Awkwardly simple and provincial. <i>A rustic bridge.</i>
suburban	Of or characteristic of a suburb. <i>Elizabeth despised Ann s house proudness as deeply suburban.</i>
<u>territorial</u>	Displaying territoriality defending a territory from intruders. <i>Territorial disputes.</i>
<u>unsophisticated</u>	Lacking refined worldly knowledge or tastes. <i>The nightlife of Montmartre awed the unsophisticated tourists.</i>

county	Relating to or characteristic of aristocratic people with an ancestral home in a particular county. <i>The county has a population of 12 345 people.</i>
depopulate	Substantially reduce the population of (an area). <i>The epidemic depopulated the countryside.</i>
<u>district</u>	An area of a country or city, especially one characterized by a particular feature or activity. <i>An elegant shopping district.</i>
<u>domestic</u>	Converted or adapted to domestic use. <i>Everything sounded very peaceful and domestic.</i>
legislature	The legislative body of a country or state. <i>The Nevada state legislature passed a law to prohibit dumping of nuclear waste.</i>
<u>local</u>	Of or belonging to or characteristic of a particular locality or neighborhood. <i>The street was full of locals and tourists.</i>
localization	(physiology) the principle that specific functions have relatively circumscribed locations in some particular part or organ of the body. <i>The tug of war between the forces of globalization and localization.</i>
metropolitan	Relating to or denoting a metropolitan or his see. <i>The Boston metropolitan area.</i>
municipal	Of or relating to the government of a municipality. <i>National and municipal elections.</i>
municipality	The governing body of a municipality. <i>Voters in each municipality choose between four candidates.</i>
<u>national</u>	Owned or maintained for the public by the national government. <i>She finished 16th at the nationals that year.</i>
parliament	A legislature similar to the UK Parliament in other nations and states. <i>The act was passed by the last parliament of the reign.</i>
parochial	Narrowly restricted in outlook or scope. <i>Parochial attitudes.</i>
populous	Densely populated. <i>The populous city of Shanghai.</i>
prefecture	The official residence or headquarters of a prefect. <i>Enraged fans besieged the Prefecture of Police.</i>

<u>province</u>	Northern Ireland. <i>I made my way home to the dreary provinces by train.</i>
<u>rural</u>	In, relating to, or characteristic of the countryside rather than the town. <i>Large rural households.</i>
<u>rustic</u>	A small brownish European moth. <i>They paused to watch the rustics dance and carouse.</i>
subdivide	Divide into smaller and smaller pieces. <i>The cells subdivided.</i>
suburban	Of or characteristic of a suburb. <i>Elizabeth despised Ann's house proudness as deeply suburban.</i>
<u>town</u>	The particular town under consideration especially one's own town. <i>Churchill was in town.</i>
urban	Relating to or concerned with a city or densely populated area. <i>Hip hop's traditionally urban vibe.</i>
<u>village</u>	A self-contained district or community within a town or city regarded as having features characteristic of village life. <i>All the village could do was listen.</i>
